

Mass Obligation: Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

In 2018, the Patronal Feast of the United States of America – the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary – and the Second Sunday of Advent occur on back-to-back days, and both days remain obligatory this year. The faithful must attend Mass at 4pm or after on Friday, December 7 or at any time on Saturday, December 8 to fulfill their obligation for the Immaculate Conception. The faithful must attend another Mass at 4 pm or after on Saturday, December 8 or at any time on Sunday, December 9 for the Second Sunday of Advent. Attending only one Mass Saturday evening, December 8 does not satisfy both obligations.

From the Parochial Vicar: Father Paul Shovelain



December 2 First Sunday of Advent

Last year at our All Saint's Day Mass, I asked our students from St. John the Baptist Catholic School, "How does one become a saint?" One of our 4th graders responded, "You go to saint's school!" Not quite the answer I was looking for, but close! In order to become a saint, one has to **learn** how to be a saint! Our mission at St. John the Baptist Catholic School is

to form saints, as we want every one of them to get to heaven one day! We educate our students in the Catholic faith. We teach religion not just as a subject but as a way life. We want to help each student become the best version of himself or herself. As Pope Benedict says, "Each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed. Each of us is loved. Each of us is necessary." Each of us is necessary to build up a better world. We appreciate each student that attends St. John's and want them to know they are loved by God. We learn many things here at St. John's, including religion, math, social studies, English, reading, music, art, and Spanish. All of these subjects are taught in such a way that the student grows into the person that God desires them to be.

We partner with our school parents to form the children in the faith and grow in their love of Jesus. We strive to witness Jesus to them by the love and kindness we share. We celebrate a weekly school Mass, which has confession available beforehand for the students. We celebrate the Sacrament of Confession twice a year as a school. We host a Middle School Retreat in November and an All School Retreat over Holy Week. These retreats are meant to strengthen the student's faith, and help their faith move from the head to the heart.

The past three years we have been teaching the *Virtues in Practice Curriculum* from Dominican Sisters of St. Cecelia Congregation in Nashville Tennessee. In the program, we teach a different virtue each month to our students. We teach them what the virtue is and give them opportunities to use it. They often go along with the time of year it is or the season of the Church. For example, last year we studied diligence (which means doing your best and working hard until you are finished) at the end of the school year. So far this year we have studied the virtues of charity, friendship, courtesy, and purity. It has been inspiring to see the students use these virtues in their life and in following the example of Jesus Christ more perfectly.

Fr. Skluzacek has asked me be more focused in the school this year in order to help form our students to love Jesus Christ. I am teaching the virtues curriculum to our students. I teach in the Middle School twice a month and the other grades once a month. I also coached Cross Country and will coach Track and Field. I eat lunch with our students regularly as well. It is truly a joy to minister to our students and bring them Jesus' love. One very memorable moment for me was our last Cross Country meet of the season. I ran with our Junior Varsity boys and encouraged them along the way. One of our 5th grade boys, Brady, took the lead right away. I ran with him giving him tips and encouraging him the whole way. At one point during the race he said, "Thank you!" and showed the virtue of courtesy! I was surprised as I just wanted him to stay focused on his form and keeping his stride going! However, he has developed the virtue of courtesy in school and in his home. In this way Christ shined right through him! He ended up winning the race and I was very happy for him! The joy I felt in his success is like the joy that God our Father has when he sees us succeed in holiness!

Our school helps our students not only exceed in academics and athletics, but ultimately and most importantly, in holiness. This weekend we are asking you to partner with our school and support the work of forming saints here at St. John the Baptist Catholic School. You should have received a letter in the mail about donating to our school. Donations can be returned in the Sunday collection or mailed.
