

From the Pastor: Father Michael Skluzáček



December 30, 2018 The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

The Christian Family

Mary asks Jesus in today's gospel, "*Son, why have you done this to us*?" (Luke 2:41-52). I would guess that every mother has asked this same question to her son. I know my mother asked me this question more than once. And, to be sure, it wasn't for doing something "holy" like staying in church for three days! Mary and Joseph could not find Jesus after three days of travel, and finally, when they did find him back in the temple, Mary asked her son this simple question, "Why did you do it? *Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety.*"

Great anxiety. Even the Holy Family experienced great anxiety. Sometimes we might have the notion that if our family is "holy," we won't experience any anxiety. But even the most "put together" family, the *Holy Family* experienced great anxiety, so our families shouldn't expect to be exempt from anxiety.

Perhaps your family struggles with "great anxiety." It might be from financial stress or dealing with sickness or with estranged parents or siblings. Most families, even though they might look picture perfect from the outside, struggle with anxieties of one kind or another.

Today's feast of the Holy Family teaches us that anxiety and tough times are part and parcel of Christian family life. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, the original Christian family (with Jewish roots) model for us the "perfect" family life, which includes struggles, anxiety, and even misunderstandings. But they also teach us how to deal with these inevitable situations in daily family life. We can learn from the Holy Family and seek to model our own Christian family life on theirs.

They teach us first of all the importance of **family worship**. Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem for the yearly feast of Passover, and they took him to the synagogue in Nazareth every Sabbath. Nowhere does the bible indicate that Mary or Joseph ever asked Jesus if he wanted to go to synagogue – it wasn't optional! They didn't allow his activities to keep him from attending worship with them every Sabbath Day. Granted, Jesus didn't have basketball games or ice time on the Lord's Day. He didn't ask to stay home and play video games. But, the bible tells us that Jesus was tempted in every way that human beings are, so we can be sure he was tempted to skip Sabbath worship. Our families today are tempted by so many activities to miss Sunday Mass. I always feel sad when I hear a child say that his/her family doesn't go to Sunday Mass because "we're too busy." What could more important than to worship God? The worship of God, *every Sunday*, is essential for a Christian family to survive amid all the anxieties of life.

The Holy Family also teaches us the importance of **obedience** and **family prayer**. Mary and Joseph were obedient to the Law by worshipping regularly. Jesus was obedient to his parents at their home in Nazareth. And he "*advanced in wisdom and age and favor*," a clear indication that studying the faith and family prayer were regular parts of their family life. Our Christian families today are called to obedience and family prayer. Husbands and wives are called to obey God's laws in their marriage. Children are called to obey their parents. And all family members are called to obey God's call to Sunday worship. May the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph guide our families to a deeper love of God and of one another.

Along with Fr. Paul Shovelain, our deacons, and all our parish staff, I wish you and your loved ones a very Happy and Holy New Year!

The first Booya Dinner was served in 1931 to raise funds for the St. John's Men's Club. Otto Schmalzbauer, Jr., asked his sister, Gertrude Lange, to cook her recipe of booya to sell. It was such a success that she donated her rec-

ipe, and ever since then the Booya Dinner has been a significant fundraiser.
