

Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe November 25, 2018

Belonging to the Truth

In today's gospel (Jn 18:33b-37), Pilate questions Jesus, asking him if he is in fact a King, and Jesus responds, "*My kingdom does not belong to this world*." Pilate does not understand, so Jesus continues, "*My kingdom is not here... For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth* listens to my voice."

In other words, Jesus is not a king who will reign upon a throne. He is a king who will reign upon a cross, showing us what true authority is, what true leadership is – giving oneself for another out of love. We look upon our King when we look at the cross, gazing upon the One who emptied himself of earthly glory so that we could follow him to heavenly glory. Jesus also indicates what we must do to share in his glory – we must **belong to the truth** by listening to his voice. The "Truth" is Jesus himself, who is the "Way, the Truth and the Life."

In Mexico, less than a hundred years ago, many faithful Christians gave their lives for Jesus Christ, their true King. The secularist government brutally enforced the strict anti-clerical laws of the Mexican constitution. All religious ceremonies, including Masses, baptisms, confirmations, weddings, etc., were banned. Bishops were forced to leave the country; priests were forbidden to wear clerical garb in public, and those who resisted were imprisoned, tortured, and in some cases killed outright.

In legitimate self defense, countless Catholics took up arms to defend the faith. Whenever they charged into battle, the *Cristeros*, as they were called, shouted: "**Viva Cristo Rey!**" – "Long live Christ the King!" Many Catholics shed their blood in this conflict; many were martyred. **Saint José Luis Sanchez del Rio** was among them. From a young age St. José had a great love for the Blessed Sacrament; he encouraged his friends to have more devotion to Our Lord and Our Lady of Guadalupe. José had a great desire to join his two brothers, who were fighting in the battles of the *Cristeros*, and he was accepted despite his youth. José was captured and imprisoned, and the enemies of Christ the King decided to kill him.

José was tortured beyond comprehension. The soles of his feet were cut off and he was forced to walk on salt. The soldiers said, "If you shout, 'Death to Christ the King," we will spare your life." José only answered: "Viva Cristo Rey!" – Long live Christ the King! Long live Our Lady of Guadalupe!" St. José was declared a martyr and was canonized by Pope Francis in 2016.

What gives someone like St. José the courage to give his life for Christ the King? It is faith – a deep faith and love for Jesus Christ. St. José **belonged to the truth**, because he listened to the voice of Jesus Christ as heard through the Church. His personal relationship with Jesus Christ the King gave him the courage to give his life for his King.

Not all the Catholics in Mexico stood up for truth in the face of persecution. Some acquiesced to the power of the state and gave up the faith. But many others chose the path of non-violent resistance. They advocated the Kingship of Jesus by filling the darkness of falsehood with the light of truth. They fought the power of hatred with the greater power of love. Blessed Miguel Pro (feast day: November 23), a Cristero priest, said before being martyred by firing squad, "We proclaim the principles of the Church, the reign of love, without forgetting that it is also a reign of justice." Viva Cristo Rey! Long live Christ the King!

The film "For Greater Glory" tells the true story of the Mexican Christero war. You can check it out from our parish library. Enriching our parish and school ministries through specific gifts is an amazing way to grow in holiness and build our church. We would never want to replace your regular, ongoing support of our parish with these wish list items but we welcome your grateful generosity!

General Parish Needs

Built-In Video Projection in St. Joseph's Hall to serve our programs, ministries, special events, and Mass overflow. Help us catch up to this technology and better serve our ministries! St. John's is often host to Archdiocesan meetings, and enhanced audio/visual capabilities would make us an even more welcoming parish! Full package of 4 built-in projectors & screens with enhanced sound system integration: **\$26,000**.

Upgrades to Parish Center Wi-Fi; New Server Storage Units. We need to reconfigure our existing wireless internet setup and add several access points to ensure secure and reliable reception for staff, parishioners, and our many guests. Additionally, our network servers are full; replace units with higher capacity servers: **\$6,200**.

Capital Reserve Fund. This fund supports the many needs of maintaining and improving our building and its mechanical operations. If you like heat in the winter and AC in the summer and an attractive campus, your gifts here support our campus! This fund supports ongoing repairs and improvements, including rectory gutters and other building upgrades. It can also support additions to our campus such as a marquee sign, rebuilding our brick flowerbeds, and purchasing maintenance equipment and vehicles.
