From the Parochial Administrator: Father Paul Shovelain

"Inviting In to Heaven"

The ultimate goal of the theme of **"Invite In"** is not to only fill our pews, or desks in our school, or make our programs successful, rather it is to get people to Heaven! This past Friday, I was privileged with two opportunities to do just that. I was checking out the newly installed altar in the Convent, when I heard the Fire Siren go off. I looked at my phone and saw that it was a Public Service Call for the Fire Department.

Since I had over an hour before my next event, I figured I would respond as I was across the street from the Fire Hall. I ran to the station and jumped on the 1st truck. On the truck, I learned that it was a medical call and we were responding to someone who was having a cardiac arrest. When we arrived, the Fire Captain asked me to sit with the wife as they worked on the patient. I realized he was one of our parishioners, so I told her that I would pray with her husband. We went over to the sun room, where he was laying and I worked my way through the Paramedic's gear. When I got to him, I prayed the Apostolic Pardon, *"Through the holy mysteries of our redemption may almighty God release you from all punishments in this life and in the life to come. **May he open to you the gates of paradise and welcome you to everlasting joy.**"* We prayed that God would **invite** him **in** to Heaven if this was to be the end of his life here on Earth.

It was very sad to see and I prayed desperately for a miracle to bring him back. They worked on him for a while, but he did not make it. It was a very grief filled time with the family. As the officers, fire-fighters and paramedics left, I remained with the wife and children. We prayed one last time together with his body before leaving. Honestly, it was very disheartening and sad. However, I was grateful to have been there and able to respond to that call for one of our parishioners.

Later that night, I was called again by a wife of one of our parishioners who had just passed. Her husband had Alzheimers and I had anointed him and given him the Apostolic Pardon the previous Sunday since we knew death was near. However, she asked me to come and pray with the family before the funeral home took his body. I did so. After arriving at the house, I wished the family my condolences and we took a moment of silence before we prayed.

As I put on my stole about to begin my prayers, I broke down. There was a tremendous weight of grief that I felt. It was extremely difficult to lose two parishioners, just a few hours apart. Since I knew them both, it made it even more difficult. Yet, as I sat there, it hit me. My role is to help them get to Heaven. We know that life on Earth is temporary, yet we really do not want it to end. However, it will someday. After this Earthly life, Eternal Life awaits us. We need to be ready, in the State of Grace (in proper relationship with God), when the time comes. I was privileged and honored to help those two men be in the State of Grace when they died. It is honestly such a privilege, but also so very difficult. However, I do have great hope that they will make it to Heaven since they received the Apostolic Pardon. This is an indulgence which is a gift that Christ gave to the Church when he commanded the Apostles, *"Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them."* (John 20:23) The Church gives priests the ability to absolve temporal punishment when someone is near death, to assist them on their journey to Heaven. In giving them the Apostolic Pardon, I am honored to not just speak as Fr. Paul, but as Christ **inviting in** a soul home to Heaven.

So take courage, and **invite in** a friend, family member, neighbor or co-worker to an event here at St. John's. The purpose of what we do here is to help people live in relationship with Jesus Christ now so that they are **invited in** to Heaven by him.

As the Father loves me, so I also love you!

This summer, we met our goals and we met some other parishioners as we participated. So what did we accomplish?

Check out what can be done in a couple of hours each event:

- 14 volunteers packed over 1300 snacks for Community Partners for Youth (CPY), a youth program here in New Brighton that operates year 'round to engage youth and encourage them in positive activities.
 - You donated many bags of food for our parish food shelf. Thank you to all of you who were so generous! And know that you can drop off donations anytime. The summer months can get lean, so please consider shopping for others next time you go grocery shopping for yourself.
 - Around 25 people of all ages went to the New Brighton Care Center to visit, play games and even sing if asked! We wound up playing dominos, dice and card games, and a 6 year old even played Connect with some of the residents. It was a quick 2 hour visit with residents staying up late and volunteers asking to go again. Be sure to join us next time – we aren't waiting until next summer, so watch for more information!
- Last week we went to Feed My Starving Children and had a great group of over 50 participate! We had a little meet and greet since we didn't all know each other, and then got to work. We had a great time and along with a couple other groups, packaged 92 boxes, which translates to 19,872 meals or feeding 54 children for a YEAR! Wow! How do you like those stats?!! 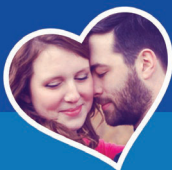
