## Sunday, August 11, 2019 **19th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

# Congrats, Sister Clarinda, on your 65<sup>th</sup> jubilee of religious life

When Sister Clarinda went to join the convent after eighth grade, she simply wanted to be a sister, she said recently. Not a doctor or a teacher, or to have any other title, just to be a sister.

Now, in her third retirement, she keeps morning office hours here at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church as a volunteer. She teaches a couple of Scripture classes, does pastoral work with the elderly, focuses on ministry to widows and widowers and is open to listening to any and all.

Her only title is "Sister." "Just Sister. That's who I am," says Sister Clarinda, "I'm willing to be anybody's sister. As an old sister told me, 'You're a young sister, do what you're supposed to do. Make sure you wear out, not rust out."



She hasn't rusted out or worn out, but is celebrating her 65th jubilee as a Sister of St. Fran-

cis of the Congregation of Our Lady of Lourdes of Sylvania, Ohio. Reflecting on her work, Sister Clarinda says, "So many people have heavy hearts and we need to have them understand we love them, we care about them no matter what, or where they came from."

Sister Clarinda says she first started thinking about becoming a sister when she was in the third grade. The sisters who taught in her school wore wool habits that had a particular smell and to her it conveyed a sense of holiness. This gave her a desire to be a sister like them. She says it has been a life she has loved since the third grade. She says she has experienced "little miracles" that showed her that God had a plan for her life. Even with hardships, she loved it because she was doing what she loved doing—being among God's people and listening to them.

God's plan involved 50 years of teaching or serving as an elementary school principal in several schools including one in Detroit with more than 1,000 youngsters and another one in Ohio with fewer than 200 students. She fondly remembers that after being at the larger school for 15 years, she sometimes said to the children at the small school, "Where is everybody?" And the students would respond, "This is all there is." She says, "I was used to streams of children."

By 1976, she was assigned to be principal of Immaculate Conception School in Columbia Heights. With this job she had come full circle, home in essence. Immaculate Conception was where she went to elementary school and met those sisters in their wool habits.

After serving in Columbia Heights for 20 years, she made her first attempt at retirement. "This is it," she remembers saying after 50 years as an educator. It didn't work. She was soon contacted by a priest in Excelsior to come to that St. John the Baptist School to "build the school back up." She told him no and that she wanted to teach adult education. But, she eventually agreed to give his school a year. However, it was six or seven years later when she left there having increased the enrollment and the number of grades. Thus, she tried to retire again.

That time, she says her Franciscan sisters said, "Well, you've got to get a job." So, she put in her application to be director of faith formation here at St. John the Baptist in New Brighton. She started in 2002 and worked here for 15 years doing faith formation, Scripture lessons, visiting the sick, taking communion to homebound people and working with RCIA. She also developed, and still uses, a form to help parishioners plan their funerals.

# Dominican sisters look forward to teaching at SJB

Both of the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary who are coming to teach at St. John the Baptist here in New Brighton have taught in another St. John the Baptist School—in Hawaii—Sister Leonarda for 10 years, from 1970 to 1980 and Sister Ermelinda from 2002 to 2008.

"What motivates me is that I hope I will make a difference in the lives of the people that I will minister to. Everything that I do is done for the Lord."

Both entered the Dominican order after high school and Sister Ermelinda notes that she celebrated her 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of being a religious sister in June.

# 'People know I am Sister Cans,' says our modest Sister Rose Vu

For some 31 years, the modest, unassuming Sister Rose Vu's ministry has included collecting aluminum cans to recycle and raise money to help the poor people of Viet Nam. She estimates she's collected enough cans to earn an average of \$300 to \$500 a year. She gets called Sister Cans, she says. "This mission is bringing the love of God to the people of Viet Nam," says Sister Rose, a Good Shepherd sister who is a native of Viet Nam. Through her non-profit, Friends of the Poor, she travels occasionally to Viet Nam and helps provide for basic needs for the poor there—buying food, fixing up homes and aiding the elderly.

Here, at home, she does fundraising and mailings, writes letters and an annual newsletter, acknowledges donations, meets benefactors, plans her trips and is currently working on a banquet this fall.

Thirty-one years ago, when she made her first trip to a local recycling center, she remembers, she

received \$1.75 for her efforts. Back then, \$1 was worth 2,600 dong, the Vietnamese currency. She says, "So with 500 dong, you can buy one bowl of soup, so I could buy six or seven bowls of soup. I said, 'Better than none.' So, I continue until today.

This quiet sister probably won't volunteer all that she has done in God's service since making her first commitment to the Sisters of the Good Shepherd in 1973 in Viet Nam. "I want to live quietly," she says humbly. "The Lord is my shepherd and He leads me and I go and serve where He needs me. Whatever I do is for His glory. I need to bring His love to people."

In April of 1975 she was on one of the historic, final flights with orphans out of Viet Nam, which was falling to the Viet Cong. She later worked with Vietnamese boat people in Macau and served unwed mothers in Korea. She has helped battered women in Chicago and worked in poor Thai villages.

Sister Rose came to St. Paul in 1987 and served in a Good Shepherd transitional housing program for homeless women for seven years. Later she was Catholic Charities volunteer coordinator for three years. She has been trained in the International Montessori Method and holds a bachelor's degree in human services and a master's degree in pastoral education and in 2009 earned a doctorate in ministry.
