# From: Mikayla Anderson, Director of Youth Ministry & Confirmation

This upcoming year, and for the next 3 years, St. John the Baptist has invested in our youth in a new way through NET Ministries. NET Ministries is a mission organization that trains, equips and sends, young (18-26) Catholic's to spread the gospel. NET missionaries are either placed on retreat teams, where they travel around the country leading weekend retreats for different parishes, or they are placed on discipleship team, where missionaries stay at the same parish all year assisting with various programing

around the parish. This weekend, we welcome NET Team 14, a discipleship team, to our SJB family.

Our 8 NET missionaries will be mainly assisting with our youth, including middle school youth group, high school youth group, confirmation preparation, family formation and being involved in St. John's middle school. By February 2020, we are hoping to start discipleship small groups for high school students. In addition, NET missionaries will be doing outreach around the community, such as attending high school sporting events, high school lunches and other community events.

Throughout their time here at SJB, missionaries will live with host families for 2 weeks at a time. Host families, are parishioners of St. John's who have generously opened up their homes for 2-4 missionaries throughout the year. Missionaries will eat meals and be integrated in family life of our parishioners. We are still in need of generous parishioners who are willing to open their home to our missionaries. Please prayerfully consider this opportunity.

As mentioned in the beginning, NET missionaries will be serving with our parish for the next 3 years, although it will not be the exact same team. Missionaries are giving up a year of their life to follow what the Lord is calling them to.

We are so blessed to have the witness of young people serving the Lord in such a counter cultural way, and SJB is going to be so blessed by their presence and ministry this year.

### **NET Team: INVITED IN to help us - GO. MAKE. TEACH**

This past week a group of eight, new, young adults showed up in the Chapel of the Angels for daily Mass. They're part of NET Ministries, which is known mainly for sending teams around the country to put on youth retreats.

But the group here at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and School is different from their traveling counterparts. They're a discipleship team and are here from now to May to work mainly with sixth through 12<sup>th</sup> graders as well as with young adults and other parishioners to get to know us and to show us how to deepen our faith lives and become messengers for Christ—disciples.

The four-women and four-men team is here as part of a three-year program to cooperate with the parish and school to develop a youth outreach plan that will allow the parish to flourish for years to come, ultimately drawing others into communion with Christ and each other.

There is one other discipleship team in Minnesota—at Providence Academy in Plymouth and one team each in Texas, Illinois and Michigan.

Eric Ramos, 23, from Duncanville, Texas, is the team leader at St. John's. He joined the NET team in July and is on his first assignment. Co-team leader is Kacey Short, also 23, from Forrest, Ill. She traveled the Midwest and South on a NET retreat team last year and was the drama leader.

Ramos says the initial job of the team will be to get to know the youth in our parish. The team will be setting up times to meet and talk with sixth to 12<sup>th</sup> graders. Forming discipleship groups is one thing they'll probably do. They'll plan events with youth minister director Mikayla Anderson. Building community with parish members will be a focus as well.

He says they won't be doing much instruction but rather talking about how God loves us and then teaching people to respond to Him by showing how team members live—with daily Mass attendance, their prayer lives, reading Scripture, in service and by sharing their faith.

"We'll be here to talk about why we're here, why we love God, showing people how to be messengers," says Ramos.

"What I want to do is to make them [the youth] know God and that He is love and that He loves them right where they are in their lives, you know. That He is just begging them to say, 'Yes,' to Him and that He wants to do wonderful things through them," says Ramos. "We are His tools and He is the master."

Ramos, a welder for two years, grew up in a charismatic community and knew of NET because some young people from the group served on NET teams. He says he found himself being drawn to people in his church and community, including NET missionaries, who truly gave themselves to Christ and then how God worked through them. He says he wanted the kind of love from God that he saw in them.

He saw them living out their faith in prayer, in goodness, in service and in spreading the Gospel to everyone they encountered. "Then I had this kind of epiphany moment, NEWS FLASH, Eric, God has always loved you like that," he says, "I had a knowledge of God before that moment, but it turned into a belief and a love of God."

For the nine months before joining NET Ministries, he was deeply involved as a volunteer in his home parish's youth ministry, young adult ministry and Bible study.

The other team leader, Short graduated from college in December 2017 with an English degree. She hadn't heard of NET Ministries until she was 21 and learned of NET from people whom she met through Totus Tuus a semester before she graduated. She says the idea of being with eight to 12 people on a team for nine months freaked her out, and, finishing her degree was at the front of her mind.

After she graduated college, she worked for a lawyer for a while and says she felt a restlessness. The work she was doing was good and she was using her degree but she just felt she wasn't where she was supposed to be. Then in January of 2018, NET popped into her mind and she went to the Net Ministries Web site and, without doing much research, applied to become a team member, she says. "I just dove in."

Part of the procedure for joining a team is an interview retreat weekend. She says she fell in love with NET that weekend. It was because of what NET is about, their mission and also that NET is geared specifically to sixth through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students. She thinks that's a very important time in a person's life. She left the retreat weekend feeling NET was where she was supposed to be. That's evidently what NET officials thought too because a week later she got a call from their recruitment director asking her if she would accept a position as a missionary.

# A mother catechizes her children and learns from them too

Melanie Dowell says she believes God gave children to her for many reasons but one of them was that He wanted her to be truly closer to Him.

Dowell cites several ways she's grown closer to Jesus through raising her kids. They include educating them at St. John the Baptist Catholic School, making a strong decision to catechize them at home, seeing her daughter involved in NET Ministries Lifeline Mass events, going through the archdiocesan Catechetical institute so she could answer more of their questions and then witnessing her kids on fire for their faith.

"I'm a cradle Catholic and I've always been involved at church and I went to school there. Both my parents were Catholics who raised us and taught us as Catholics. But that personal connection to Jesus, I don't believe I truly had until really my kids showed me how to do that. Thank God that I learned how to do that," she says.

Mother and daughter have attended a number of NET events together. Melanie says that as a parent her participation in NET has opened her up to the Holy Spirit to guide her children in their faith. While she and her daughter, Emma, have always been close, Dowell says that Emma's participation in NET has brought them closer and bonded them through her daughter's journey with her faith.

"She's [Emma] shared so much of her faith with me. She's learned so much and I truly believe that she has Jesus in her heart and she brings Jesus to places where you can't freely talk about Jesus," says Dowell. "It's something that I feel is such an amazing blessing in our lives. I'm so grateful that she is choosing that for her life," says Dowell.

Emma, a junior at Irondale High School, has been to Extreme Faith Camp several times and Melanie and Emma have gone together to three Steubenville Youth Conferences. Emma is part of a NET Teen Ministry Team and helps out with monthly NET Lifeline Masses.

An active parishioner, Melanie has been involved at St. John the Baptist in Sunday school, family formation, small groups for confirmation, youth group and as a sacristan. She works in the mornings at the parish's pre-school. She has a full-time job at CSI in New Brighton too.

Her daughter isn't her only child who is going to NET activities. Melanie says Jack, a middle school student, has seen changes in his sister, taken an interest in getting involved in the activities for older students and has started going to NET Masses also.

"I enjoy seeing my kids on fire for their faith at such a young age," she says. "It's a priority to them. It humbles me and helps me as a parent. I learn so much from my kids."

Dowell says she and her two children have helped each other and working with them broke whatever barrier she had in her faith and moved her to a new level in her faith and in relationship to Christ.

She says her husband Adam is an unbeliever. She calls him a wonderful husband and a wonderful father and says he supports her in her belief in sending the children to St. John's. "My kids, they're just amazing. Their strength and their faith is amazing and how we live our lives will bring him to God."

### Larry Gillespie looks forward to work of NET Team, discusses faith formation at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church & School

Lifelong St. John the Baptist parishioner Larry Gillespie says that he's hoping the NET Team members will help our school teach its students to be warriors for Christ and adds he wants to do all he can to support this ministry.

It's not about developing careers and going out and making millions, but about developing their faith lives, he says. It's about their coming to see Jesus as their brother and Mary as their mother.

Gillespie says he is glad that the Dominican sisters have come to St. John's too. He feels the sisters and the NET Team can work to produce good Catholics and good leaders who will have good marriages, which will strengthen the Church. He says he is hopeful that the presence of the sisters in their habits will inspire vocations to the religious life too.

He says he's heard that NET missionaries are "so successful" in developing Catholic students.

Gillespie, a daily Mass participant, says he loves going to the weekday Masses attended by our students. "That was me 60 years ago," he says and remembers going to Mass at least one day a week when he attended St. John's school. He reminisced recently about going to Mass in the auditorium and said someone else told him they remembered going three days a week. He says daily Mass is one of the most important things about being a member here. He has been going to daily Mass for about 30 years. He started with the intention of going to daily Mass for about a month during one Lent and has "been going ever since."

Gillespie likes starting his day with Mass and Communion, the body of Christ, he says, "Give us this day our daily bread. It's such a gift."

The people of St. John's are his family, Gillespie says, "my church family." He sings the praises of the parish and, among many things, is grateful to Father Paul and Deacon Peter D'Heilly for the support they gave him when his wife died two and a half years ago. He says they encouraged him that it wasn't the end of life, but it is a different life.

As part of his membership here, Gillespie has served in such ministries as the food shelf, meals on wheels and taking Communion to people in nursing homes. He says, "I tell them how much God loves them. They're suffering and many can feel abandoned. It's important to remind them they're loved."

Outside the parish, he is president of the North-Minneapolis Serra Club, which is an international organization promoting and supporting vocations, priests, seminarians and religious as well as encouraging members' personal holiness. He listens to Relevant Radio and watches EWTN, which he says are "so wonderful" in spreading the Catholic news .

Going on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land in 2009 with other St. John the Baptist members and then in 2010 to Medjugorje in Bosnia with a group led by parishioner Stephanie Percic increased his faith and his love for Jesus.

"Just being in the Holy Land and walking on that dirt that Jesus walked on, that was powerful for me," Gillespie says. "It may sound trite, but my focus is on a daily life in my faith."


