From the Parochial Administrator: Father Paul Shovelain

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph experienced great suffering in their early years of family life. First of all, it was an unexpected pregnancy. Yet, Joseph and Mary came together and supported each other as they welcomed the Messiah into their lives. The setting of Jesus' birth was not ideal as they welcomed him into the world in the midst of smelly barn animals. Shortly after he was born many people came to see the Christ child. While this could have made his parents proud, I think of how parents of newborns do not want many visitors as they do not want their infant to be exposed to so many germs or illnesses. Yet, Mary and Joseph bore it patiently. Just when all the people were finally leaving and they

were possibly settling into a rhythm of life, their world was turned upside down as Herod tried to kill the baby Jesus out of fear. They fled to Egypt where they sought protection. There they lived in a foreign land with unfamiliar customs and language barriers. Yet, they did it in order to fulfill God's plan and to keep the Christ child safe. This heroic sacrifice helped the baby Jesus to escape Herod's plot and so fulfill the plan of God the Father which brought about the redemption of the world! After Herod died, they were able to return to Nazareth where they raised Jesus. This weekend we honor the Holy Family and celebrate Immigration Sunday. The Holy Family had to experience the same struggles as immigrants today, like foreign customs, unfamiliar language and societal challenges. Yet, they persevered through them with great hope for a better future. Let us pray for those who have immigrated to the USA. We welcome them and love them as human persons created in the image and likeness of God. As Pope Benedict stated, "Each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed. Each of us is loved. Each of us is necessary." As we welcome the immigrants from Africa, Central America, South America, Asia, the Middle East or other areas, let us remember their God given dignity and treat them as persons who deserve to be treated with respect. May we show them Christ in our hospitality, speech and kindness.

A Quick Look Back

As we come to the close of 2019, I want to take a moment to look back at the last year and thank you and God for his blessings. In July, I transitioned to Parochial Administrator and it has been a blessing to serve you in this capacity. Fr. Skluzacek continues to serve as my supervising pastor and I check in with him about once a week via phone. Also in July, Fr. Magner began serving our parish and it has been a joy to serve alongside him here. We saw a great outpouring of support for the Dominican Sisters of the Most Holy Rosary as we welcomed them in August. We honored Sister Clarinda for her 65 years of consecrated life and the presence of her order in our parish for so many years. We started the school year in September with the largest growth our school has experienced in over a decade! The NET team began their ministry to our middle and high school students in mid-September. It has gone well and we have seen much growth in our youth program. We had a wonderful FallFest that so many dedicated volunteers and staff worked hard to pull off! In October and November we rolled out our Core Values of Reliance on Prayer, Willingness to Grow and Generous Spirit alongside our One Spirit Many Gifts Renewal. There was a noticeable increase in pledges, which we are hoping will materialize with actual gifts in the upcoming year. We saw parishioners live out of a generous spirit with the very positive response these past several months to various requests including the Baby Bush, the Sisters Giving Tree, food drive, sock and underwear drive, and Angel tree. We saw 125+ parishioners exercise a reliance on prayer and a willingness to grow by committing to Encounter Reach More Small Groups. Many others continue to frequent our well established parish ministries that enable us to grow into the disciples God is inviting us to be!

While there has been more funerals than baptisms in recent years, we did have more baptisms than funerals in November thanks to only one funeral! While we certainly have had various challenges, thanks be to God, this year has gone very well. As we come to the close of 2019, I am looking forward to 2020 and building up Christ's kingdom with of all you in New Brighton and beyond! Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

Two other ways to give.

Electronic giving. We offer a convenient electronic giving option that allows donations to be withdrawn directly from your bank account or debit/credit card on a scheduled, automatic basis. This method of giving allows both the donor and the parish to budget and allocate funds more accurately. Donations can be scheduled at a time of month convenient to you, and can be adjusted or suspended at any time. Authorization forms are available in the church office and on the parish website.

Gifts of stock. A gift of appreciated stock is a good way to donate - you get to claim for tax purposes the full

value of the gift when given to St. John's, and you avoid paying tax on the gain in the stock's value (capital gains). See your tax adviser to find out what works best for you.

Opportunities to Grow and Pray for Children and Youth

Family Formation – is the Catholic formation program we use for children in grades 1-6. It is an original approach to passing on the Faith, with parents having a hands-on approach to the education of their children. Family Formation meets once a month for both parents and children. We encourage everyone to go to 5:30 PM Mass, and even reconciliation at 5:00 PM since we

provide child care, then we have dinner together at 6:00 pm, and Family Formation begins from 6:30 -8:00 PM. Each month has a different topic to focus on through 4 lessons. Each lesson is a great way to gather the family and build faith at home so that it is woven into the fabric of the family. Faith is meant to be lived every moment of the day, not just at church. All are invited to join us for the adults presentation. The next presentation will be on January 8 - Jesus As The Heart Of The Home (Jesus In The Eucharist) with speaker Kristen Carlstrom

Children's Liturgy of the Word - Do you ever wonder what happens when the children leave during the readings and homily at Mass and then return at offertory time? Children, grades 1-4 go to Children's Liturgy of the Word in the Chapel of the Angels. We read the readings of the day at the children's level and then have our own homily with them. The children learn about blessing themselves with holy water at the font, bowing to the altar in the chapel, seating quietly to experience God's peace, the proper responses to the parts of the Mass as well as the lessons in each Sunday's readings. Most times, the children have the opportunity to respond to God by writing on an offertory envelope that they place in the basket upon their return to the main church. Adults are welcome if you'd like to accompany your child (or grandchild).

First Sacraments - We are well on our way to preparing children for their **First Sacraments** this year. We are on track for 45 young people to receive First Reconciliation in February and who will then prepare for First Eucharist for May. Since parents are the primary educators of their children, they are preparing their children, while we help by providing retreats, encouraging and guiding them. If you have a 2^{nd} or 3^{rd} grader who is ready for these Sacraments and are not registered, please call Mary at 651.633.1540 x1234. For all the rest of you, please keep the children in your prayers as they grow as Catholics and St. John the Baptist parishioners.

Do you have a child older than 2nd grade, who needs to catch up on sacraments? We are here to help with that! The Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC) is available for anyone who needs to catch up on the First Sacraments: Baptism, Reconciliation and Eucharist. We meet with the parents and child(ren) regularly and prepare the children to receive the sacraments after a few months or preparation.
