From the Parochial Administrator: Father Paul Shovelain

On this great Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, I would like to share with you some information about our beautiful new icon of St. John the Baptist. It was written by local artist Nicholas Markell and given as a gift from parishioner Juanita Zamor in honor of her late husband Kyrán, who served as a superintendent on the construction of the New Church in 1968. We are hoping to commission a second icon depicting our Blessed Mother to compliment the icon on the other side of the sanctuary.

Description of St. John Icon from Iconographer, Nicholas Markell

“Traditionally, the icon of St. John the Baptist, also known as St. John the Forerunner, depicts him as a wild man, disheveled and rough, the one who lived on locust and honey.

He is the last of the Old Testament prophets and his message is bold. His look is weathered. He is the one who flourishes in the elements of the desert, not the comforts of a house. His message is not so much to bring comfort but to bring transformation. His glance not stern, but solemn. His presence is serious but filled with hope.

His garments are symbolic. The camel hair tunic is imaged in blue like waves of water since John is the baptizer. Camels are animals known for their ability to store water so that they can be nourished in the desert heat. It is a reminder that the grace of our water baptism will nourish and sustain us over the dry periods of life.

His cross staff is a symbol that he was a martyr. His belt is green, the color of new life, and his outer garment that of gold, for he is the “greatest man born of a woman.” The icon background is 24 krt gold. Pure gold is a symbol of majesty and the hue of the eternal city. Everything in the icon appears to be started with the light of heaven.

His scroll is a symbol of his proclamation. The word illuminates and gives life.

The icon of St. John balances the pastoral approach of the church with a prophet one. His scroll usually reads “Repent, for the Kingdom of God is at hand”, or “Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world.” He calls us to repent, be baptized, and believe. He points to the Lamb of God who is Christ our Eucharist. St. John reminds us that we are to become less and Christ more.”

Choir Area Renovation

In the upcoming weeks, you will notice some work taking place in the area where the choir sings. We are adjusting their location in order to enhance the sound of our beautiful choir. They will be able to project more fully towards the congregation. This will also eliminate the need for the risers as well as the movement during the liturgy which can be distracting at times. We are able to fund this renovation through the generosity of special gifts from parishioners.

As the Father loves me, so I also love you!

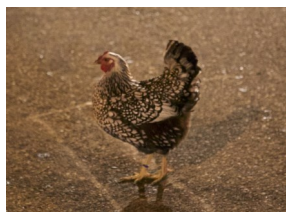

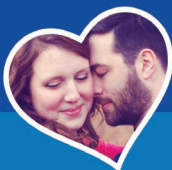
