




From the Parochial Administrator: Father Paul Shovelain

Give me a drink! Jesus wants to share vessels with the woman at the well in our Gospel this weekend. Given our current situation, we would advise Jesus to drink from a different vessel, yet he wants to meet her where she is at as he desires communion with her. Jesus broke the cultural norms and talked to the Samaritan woman at the well because he wanted to share God's healing love with her. After receiving God's powerful love, she goes to the people of her town and invites them to meet Christ! She lives out our theme as she invites others into relationship with Jesus. Having received love in her encounter with the Lord, it gave her

strength to grow in confidence and share the Good News with others! The Lord desires to share with us that same love as we too are invited to grow into disciples who share the Good News!

Now we do not want to share germs or vessels, but we do want to share the Good News! So we need to be prudent and help people stay healthy. Hence we have followed Archbishop Hebda's recommendation to reduce risk of spreading illness. We have removed the Holy Water from the fonts. We are also choosing to suspend the sign of peace as well as communion from the chalice. Thank you for your understanding. If there are any additional changes or adaptations we will communicate them to you in the Thursday email or future bulletins.

This does give us an opportunity to think about why we do these things. We use Holy Water to remind us of our Baptism and our relationship with the Trinity. Although you will not be using Holy Water from the font, I encourage you to make the sign of the cross as you genuflect before entering your pew. Being intentional about this will help you remember your baptism and that you are called to live always in union with the Trinity. Although we do not offer the sign of peace, I encourage to be cordial in and out of church. We want to be know as a welcoming community. While we may want to exchange a hand shake, others may not, so we want to help people be at ease and not worry about shaking hands with someone they do not know. The sign of peace is meant to help us remember that we need to wish peace to others including those we struggle to love. So, even though there is no sign of peace, I encourage you to pray for those people you struggle to love at Mass.

Receiving the Eucharist in only the form of bread is still sufficient as Christ is fully present there. It causes to realize what a gift it is to receive the Eucharist as it cannot be taken for granted. We are still allowing people to receive communion on the tongue. However, we want to remind you, after saying Amen, stick your tongue out and keep your head still until we have placed the host on your tongue. We normally are able to avoid contact between our finger and your tongue, but sometimes people do not do one of those three things which makes it difficult. Thank you for your cooperation.

Updates:

The Director of Worship position has been posted as we seek to hire Jay Hunstiger's successor. While this is a challenging task and will require some adjustments, we are confident that the Lord will guide us through this process. Please pray that this transition be to the Holy Spirit and we trust where the Lord leads us. The posting can be found at https://careers.archspm.org/jobs/

This weekend's bulletin includes the statement from Archbishop Hebda regarding the allegation against Monsignor Koscielniak. We are continuing to cooperate with the family and the Archdiocese through the investigation process. We have been asked to share the statement 4 times in the bulletin and this is the 3rd time. It will also be in this week's Catholic Spirit.

Next week I will be taking my yearly retreat at the Monastery of the Most Holy Name of Jesus Discalced Carmelites Nuns in Denmark, WI. It is 17 miles south of the Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help, one of my favorite places to pray! Please be assured of my prayers for you all.

As the Father loves me, so I also love you!



Gift of Living in the Divine Will Prayer Group

Join us on April 2 from 7-8:30pm in room 204 as we meet for the Gift of Living in the Divine Will Prayer Group. There is no commitment, come when you can. The meeting follows the format of prayers set forth by Fr. Iannuzzi based on Luisa's writings.

Fr. Iannuzzi wrote his dissertation on the writings of Servant of the Lord, Luisa Piccarreta. Her messages from the Lord and the Blessed Mother, which have been approved by the Church, are ones for all mankind. The Lord gave up His life for us and part of His gift is the Gift of Living in the Divine Will. This gift will restore what we lost through Adam. Luisa wrote twenty volumes plus, 8500 pages. Fr. Iannuzzi has condensed these writings, via his dissertation, into a book that all can read and understand.

Born in 1865 in Corato, Italy, Luisa Piccarreta began receiving revelations at age 12 and was called by God to become a victim soul. God spoke to her about the gift he wishes to bestow upon the world that will set it free and inaugurate an Era of Peace. God refers to this gift as "Living in the Divine Will", for it is through an act of God's will that mankind will turn back to God's friendship and live in peace and harmony with the world around him.

Saint Hannibal Maria Di Fancia was one of Luisa's confessors and very much promoted her writings. St. Hannibal read a few pages of the Hours of our Lord's Passion written by Luisa, specifically, from the hour of Crucifixion to Pope St. Pius X and the Pope interrupted him saying: "Father, this book should be read while kneeling: It is Jesus Christ who is speaking!"

Did you know there is already a religious order that have these writings at their very core? They are called the Benedictine Daughters of the Divine Will. Check them out at benedictinesofdivinewill.org

Global Solidarity Sunday Weekend: March 21/22

This year the theme is, "...I was blind and now I see" (Jn. 9:25). Statement from Archbishop Bernard Hebda regarding Monsignor Paul Koscielniak

The Archdiocese has received an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor against Monsignor Paul Koscielniak (deceased/1980). The persons making the allegation met recently with Bishop Andrew Cozzens, Director of Ministerial Standards and Safe Environment Tim O'Malley and Ramsey County Attorney John Choi.

This is an allegation. All such allegations are taken seriously and investigated thoroughly in an effort to determine factually what occurred. There should be no presumption of guilt or wrongdoing. Facts will determine the outcome. In accord with Archdiocesan policy, this matter will be investigated and referred to the Ministerial Review Board for a recommendation regarding whether the allegation is substantiated or not.

The alleged abuse is said to have occurred multiple times between 1969-1975. Monsignor Koscielniak served at Saint John the Baptist from 1950-1977. The allegation is that a boy, who served as an altar boy, was abused between the ages of 10 and 15 at the rectory and other locations. The Office of Ministerial Standards and Safe Environment (OMSSE) is investigating and seeks the assistance from anyone with information. Please contact the OMSSE if you are aware of anything that may be pertinent.
