“Be Not Afraid”

This past week the local movie channel was playing a marathon of “Friday the 13th” movies from the ‘80’s and ‘90’s. Having seen the original movie in 1980 I decided to watch for a while. It didn’t take long to make me remember how dumb and predictable those movies were. Each sequel was essentially a remake of the first one. And, despite the gratuitous gore, they weren’t particularly scary. On the other hand, the 1975 film, “Jaws”, continues to stand out in people’s memories as a terrifying movie. The reason for this is because it preyed upon the fears of the viewer by cleverly NOT showing the killer shark for most of the film. The filmmakers capitalized on the fact that the monster you imagine is often far scarier than the monster you can actually see.

We are experiencing a time in history when fear of the unknown is ruling many people’s lives. The monsters of our imagination are causing panic throughout the world. What if this quarantine continues to last all year? What if I get sick? What if I’m not able to keep my business going? What if we run out of money with no income? Unfortunately, these are all valid questions. The unknown answers and the lack of control can prey on all our fears. Yet, in spite of all of these things our God still asks us to trust in Him.

Time and time again in the Gospels, Jesus tells His disciples, “Do not be afraid.” He knew that the things they saw Him do - walking on water, being transfigured on the mountaintop, appearing to them after His resurrection - would be terrifying to them because they had never experienced anything like it before. But that is the nature of humanity. The first time we encounter something outside of our experience can be frightening to us. But after the encounter we often realize there was really nothing to fear. Older people are often less likely to be fearful of changes that occur in life because their life experience has taught them that these things happen from time to time. Wars, disease, droughts, and economic upheavals have all happened before and will happen again. And even though a pandemic is something that none of us have lived through before, this too shall pass.

The fear of the unknown is completely understandable. One thing that IS known to us as disciples of Christ is His promise that He will be us at all times. That is real. That is fact. God never abandons us at any point in our lives. In the moments when we are afraid and feel helpless, perhaps a simple prayer from the Book of Lamentations can remind us that we are not ever alone in our lives:

But I will call this to mind,
as my reason to have hope:
The favors of the Lord are not exhausted,
his mercies are not spent;
They are renewed each morning,
so great is his faithfulness.
My portion is the Lord, says my soul;
therefore will I hope in him.

(Lamentations 3:21-24)



Divine Mercy Sunday

Celebrating God's Merciful Love

In the Jubilee Year 2000, [Pope John Paul II](#) proclaimed that from that year forward the Second Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. This was proclaimed at the Canonization Mass of St. Faustina Kowalska. St. Faustina (1905–1938) was born and raised in Poland. Following a vocation to religious life, she was accepted by the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. As a member of the Congregation, she worked as a cook, gardener, and porter. Jesus chose St. Maria Faustina Kowalska to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. St. John Paul II explains:

This was precisely the time when those ideologies of evil, nazism and communism, were taking shape. Sister Faustina became the herald of the one message capable of off-setting the evil of those ideologies, that fact that God is mercy—the truth of the merciful Christ. And for this reason, when I was called to the See of Peter, I felt impelled to pass on those experiences of a fellow Pole that deserve a place in the treasury of the universal Church. ~ Pope Saint John Paul II, Memory and Identity (2005)

St. Faustina's Diary records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed, for example:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy. (Diary, no. 699)

The Image: Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that “Jesus, I trust in You” be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: “I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish” (Diary, no. 48) and “By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls” (Diary, no. 742).

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy: The Chaplet was also given to St. Faustina with this promise: “Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you” (Diary, no. 1541). “Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire that the whole world know My infinite mercy” (Diary, no. 687).

The Divine Mercy Novena: Jesus gave St. Faustina nine intentions for which to pray the Chaplet beginning on Good Friday and ending on the Saturday before Divine Mercy Sunday. <http://www.ewtn.com/devotionals/mercy/novena.htm>


