From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain

“As the Father loves me, so I also love you!” I echo these words of Jesus Christ as I begin my time as pastor here at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and School. Even though we have experienced tremendous challenges in the last few months, I am confident that the Father’s love remains with us. We in turn are invited to share his love with others. My hope is that through my service as pastor, I will continue to make his love present and felt. My desire is for all of you to respond to his love with joy and follow the Lord more closely, inviting others into that love as well.

This last year, we have focused on the theme of “Inviting In.” Our goal was to invite others into our parish to grow in their relationship with God. We invited people in specifically to pray, grow and invest. Thank you for answering that invitation in so many ways! From praying at Mass to praying in the adoration chapel, to praying in the parks, to praying in our church parking lot, many people entered into relationship with God through these prayer opportunities. From our students growing in our school, to students growing in Faith Formation, to adults growing in Bible Studies and Reach More small groups, and many other opportunities, people grew in their knowledge and love of the Lord. From investing in our church, to investing in the school, to investing in the NET Team, to investing in the religious sisters present at SJB, to investing in the Catholic Services Appeal and many other opportunities, our parishioners invested in building up the Kingdom of God in New Brighton and beyond. Thank you for responding to the invitation to pray, grow and invest!

My vision for my first year as pastor is ***“United in the Holy Spirit.”*** There are a lot of things that try to divide us, especially sin. We need to work to root out sin and remain united in the Holy Spirit who desires to lead us back to God. We are divided physically right now. We are asked to social distance and those in the high-risk category are encouraged to stay home. Yet, despite this physical separation, we are united in the Holy Spirit. It is often said that the love between God the Father and the Son is the Holy Spirit. As I communicate the Father’s love to you in the body of Christ, I desire there to be a sense of authentic unity in that love. What makes unity authentic? It is not forced or politically driven, but from the heart. We freely desire to remain with the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit. Having responded to the invitation to be invited in, may we be “United in the Holy Spirit.” Providentially, the two previous times Archbishop Hebda has celebrated Mass here, we have had the same Gospel, John 20. This passage focused on the work of the Holy Spirit. Jesus encounters the apostles and states twice, “Peace be with you.” Then he gave the Holy Spirit to the apostles commanding them to forgive sins which brings about peace and unity.

This weekend we have a different Gospel, Matthew 13. Although not mentioned directly, the Holy Spirit is the one who helps us to hear the Word of God and understand it. The passage sets forth the parable of the sower. This past year we have invited people in, and they have responded in different ways, just like the seed that the sower planted. May we not lose hope but be grateful for what we do have and work to cultivate that. **The Lord desires to unite us in the Holy Spirit** and strengthen the gifts he has planted in our hearts.

SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680) ~ July 14

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville-Ossernenon to Native Americans - in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. 


