From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain



Join me at SJB! We are glad you are here! Maybe you are reading this online, or before Mass, or after receiving this bulletin in the mail. Regardless of where you are, we are glad you are part of our parish! This past year has been hard and has stretched us in ways we never thought we could be pulled. Yet, the grace of the Holy Spirit has helped us to adapt in bringing the saving message of Christ to New Brighton and beyond.

This was the last weekend of public Masses a year ago and that drove us to offer virtual Masses. We continue to live stream Masses, as there is a dispensation from Archbishop Hebda from attending Sunday Mass in person. We plan to continue to live stream Masses indefinitely as it helps us fulfill our mission to GO. MAKE. TEACH. Yet, we are highly encouraging parishioners to return to Mass, unless you have a serious reason not to, such as you are high risk or caring for a high-risk family member. It is easy to get in the habit of watching Mass from home because it is more convenient. However, we miss you and we desire you to receive the fullness of Christ in the Eucharist at Mass.

It is also important to note, Mass is a GET TO not a have to. This is especially true as we look back a year ago and people were not able to attend Mass from March 19 through May 26, 2020 due to the shutdown. We are happy to be open and continue to take all the necessary precautions so that we can remain open to serve you spiritually! We GET TO celebrate Mass together and it is so beautiful to pray with a church filled with people worshiping God while taking precautions to mitigate risks.

Every Tuesday, I meet with several staff members to discuss any changes to the government mandates. We adjust accordingly and discuss how the past weekend went. We also look ahead to the upcoming week(s) and plan accordingly. We continue to adapt to serve you spiritually as best we can while maintaining your physical safety. The MN Department of Health Faith Based Outreach Workgroup sends me regular updates and I communicate with the New Brighton Department of Public Safety as needed. I share this to show you how seriously we are taking the pandemic.

Why do we go to such great lengths to maintain your safety? Because we want you here at SJB to encounter Jesus in the Sacraments and in our community. I hope you were able to watch the "Join me at SJB" video in this past Thursday's email. It is on YouTube and Facebook as well as the local Cable Station NineNorth (formerly CTV). It was filmed with our parishioners, whose pictures are on the cover of this bulletin. These parishioners have been strengthened by the unshakeable presence of Christ here at SJB. One of them shared, "In the chaos of the world, I have found true peace in the Mass." Please share the video with others!

Our ministry changes hearts and minds for Christ. Thus, it is important that we do all we can to bring people to Jesus. Please check out our GMT Newsletter, found on page 7, which highlights parishioners who are preparing to receive Christ in the Sacraments. They have already experienced Jesus in our community and desire to go deeper through the reception of the Sacraments. Please pray for them and all who come through our doors. We desire to help every person grow in relationship with Jesus Christ in the Catholic Church.

We especially invite you to plan to join us for Holy Week as we recall Jesus' life, death and resurrection. Palm Sunday Masses will be Saturday at 4:30pm and Sunday at 8:30am, 10:30am, and 5:30pm. Mass on Holy Thursday, April 1st will be celebrated at 7:00pm. On Good Friday, April 2nd, Stations of the Cross will be prayed at noon. The Solemn Service will be held that afternoon at 3pm and Tenebrae at 8:00pm. The Easter Vigil, will be celebrated on Holy Saturday at 8:00pm and Easter Sunday Masses will be at 7:30am, 9:30am, and 11:30am. We are looking forward to celebrating with you!

Pandemic, uncertain times pushed Claesons to SJB and RCIC for the children

My name is Kristin Claeson and my husband is Michael Claeson. I am a certified registered nurse anesthetist at Abbott Northwestern Hospital. My husband is an IT consultant at TR Computer Sales. Our children both attend St. John the Baptist School. Elizabeth is 8 and in third grade. Evan is 5 and in kindergarten.

Michael was raised and still is Catholic. I was raised Lutheran but would like to eventually become part of the Catholic Church. I currently go to Mass with our family at SJB. We always intended to raise our kids Catholic.

We have been interested in sending our children to SJB for school since Elizabeth was in kindergarten but didn't start until this year; the fall of 2020. We heard many wonderful things about the school through multiple families in our neighborhood. The pandemic pushed us to explore SJB. We wanted our children to attend school. We also felt strongly that in uncertain times like these faith, God and community were more important than ever. We almost felt as if it was divine intervention.

Our children were not baptized prior because we never really had a "home base" church. We didn't go regularly to one church. Once we started school at SJB we knew we had found our "home base" in the school and the church. We have found the faith community we have been waiting for.

We have grown along with our children in our faith as they grow in theirs. Their excitement about their religion classes in school as well as the RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) lessons on Sunday mornings have brought up many talking points in our family. Michael and I believe our children are teaching us as much as we are teaching them. It has really made our family grow together in our faith and relationship with God.

Elizabeth and Evan are most looking forward to learning about God and continuing to grow in their relationships with Him through receiving their sacraments. They are looking forward to participating in the church community and getting to work with their classmates at SJB for the rest of their sacraments.

For Michael and Rebekah Sharp becoming Catholic is a big step, as marriage was

During this year's Easter Vigil at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, Michael and Rebekah will become Catholics and receive the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus in the Eucharist. Receiving the Real Presence in Communion is what they are yearning for—together.

Their journey to the Catholic Church manifested itself after Michael became interested in older, more liturgical forms of worship. He grew up in an evangelical church. He says he also heard people he didn't know discussing social and political issues and articulating their Catholic faith very well. "So I started getting interested in some of the issues and also came to appreciate that the Catholic Church had held the line on certain questions like abortion, contraception and marriage and things like that," he says.

Michael and Rebekah Sharp continued

Michael and Rebekah moved back home to Rochester, Minnesota, after he finished physician assistant school in Arizona in 2017. It was then he proposed becoming Catholic. She says she was on a different page and her answer was a "practical" no because she thought Catholics don't have child care at church and she had two little babies. Now, they have their three children and are expecting another this spring.

Rebekah says that she had been raised with a prejudice against Catholicism. Yet it was getting back to her family of origin that brought them to St. John the Baptist.

Her father has Alzheimer's and because of that, she says, Michael graciously moved the family to New Brighton last July. Rebekah says, "When we moved again he said, 'I need to become Catholic, I can't not become Catholic, and at least start to begin going to a Catholic Mass and I want to take this class."

She says she felt very strongly that they could not be a house divided and be going to two different churches so they started reading, "Born Fundamentalist, Born Again Catholic," by David Currie, a former Protestant preacher who explains the theology of his becoming a Catholic. So, last September they started St. John's Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults classes. And as Lent is passing, they both say they are excitedly looking forward to receiving the Sacraments.

Rebekah says, "In the past two years, and in the class, the more that I've yearned to partake in the Eucharist, not just with the Church and not the belief that it's the full body and blood of Christ, but to do it with him. This whole process has been so beautiful for our marriage. I'm super excited to be part of it." Michael says, "Over the past two or three years, I was really hungry for the Real Presence. It's been interesting now as we're getting closer to it. It's less excitement and more nerves. I don't know if I'm up for this. This is a big deal. "I'm excited for this but I just also know there's a big step and we both view this as a lifelong commitment, how we did walking into marriage."

Rebecca, Francis look to their relationship with God as they approach marriage

The story of Rebecca David's and Francis Aurelious's long distance relationship and upcoming marriage Sept. 4 could be a Hallmark movie, but it would be better story because it is based on their shared connection to God.

In her responses in a telephone interview and in Francis's email comments about marriage preparations offered though St. John the Baptist Catholic Church, they revealed how much they value their relationship with God.

Their story begins with their families having fled war-torn Sudan and living in a refugee camp in Uganda in the 1990s. Both Rebecca, 26, and Francis, 31, were born in Uganda. Francis moved to Canada when he was 12, about a year after his father died. His uncle and wife and brother had sponsored him. Rebecca's family immigrated to New Brighton when she was 9.

As Rebecca tells her family's story, she repeatedly talks of faith being instilled in her family and the importance of growing their relationship with God whether escaping a war, coming to St. John's, being able to go to our Catholic school or getting married.

And as she looks to the future, she says of the sacrament of Marriage, "It's the next step we take as Christians to continue building that relationship but also sharing the love that God has put in our hearts with our significant other."

How did they meet? Well, they're part of the Ma'adi people, an ethnic group in South Sudan and Uganda. Rebecca explains they met at an annual Ma'adi conference in the U.S. when she was in college.

Francis picks up the story: "When I met Rebecca, she was just in her first or second year of university. When I first saw her, I knew that she was the one and immediately I sounded the trumpet to my mother back home in Uganda. Funny enough, she had already met Rebecca and lived with her (in the refugee camp) just before she and her family migrated to United States.

"And my mother had just confirmed that my spirit—that trusts in God—had been confirmed, that I have made the right choice and that God already knew I was going to marry Rebecca! In God, through God I trust that I'm ready." Rebecca plans to move to Canada after they marry. Right now, she is the communication coordinator for People Serving People and he's in the Canadian military in Toronto.


