COVID-19 PROTOCOLS FOR MASS

AS OF APRIL 28, 2021

Pre-Mass

- Any of the faithful who are ill, experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19, or caring for someone who is ill are asked to refrain from attending Mass in the Church.
- Persons 65 years of age and older, and those with serious health issues, are encouraged for their own physical health and well-being to not attend Mass in church per the MN Department of Health guidelines. (Our Saturday evening Vigil Mass at 4:30 PM will continue to be live-streamed each weekend on Facebook, YouTube and local CTV channel 15 or 859.) However, your spiritual health is important to us and we will not turn people away unless we reach the maximum number our space will hold.
- Face coverings or masks are **required** for all attendees 5 years of age and older.
- Please arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass so you can be safely seated before Mass begins.
- Please keep your household socially distanced at least 6 feet from other attendees as you enter and leave the campus, wait on sidewalks to enter, and walk through the parking lot and other common spaces. Please keep small children close and do not allow them to wander.
- Exterior and interior doors will be propped open when possible to minimize contact with door handles. The south doors of the church will only be used as exits and not entrances.
- Households, please stay together as you enter in order to be seated together.
- You will be invited to sanitize your hands when you enter the church. Hand sanitizer stations will be available at the entrances of the church.

- Families are encouraged to bring coloring books or quiet toys for their children during Mass as we will not have the Mass Activity Bags available.
- The collection will be taken by ushers during offertory. Please remain in place and the ushers will come to you. Please consider online donations if possible.
- When seating is maximized with social distancing, Mass attendees will be directed to overflow seating in St. Joseph Hall. Signs will be posted as reminders to maintain safe distancing and sanitary guidelines.
- High-use areas of the church, including restrooms, will be disinfected before and after each liturgy.
- The baptismal font will remain empty. Touchless Holy Water dispensers are located near the confessionals.
- Some pews are marked off to provide proper spacing. Please sit only in the pews indicated by the signs. The seating area by the St. John the Baptist Icon is open seating. Please maintain appropriate distancing when sitting in this section.
- After the Mass is over, please maintain social distancing as you exit the church.


During Mass

- We have modified our singing and ask those singing to sing softly.
- The offering of a physical sign of peace is permitted only within households. We encourage you to smile, nod, or wave to others and wish them verbally the peace of Christ.

Reception of Holy Communion

- Communion will be distributed during Mass with communion lines coming forward from the main seating sections of the church. Please follow usher's directions and maintain appropriate distancing when processing forward. A Eucharistic Minister will bring Communion to people in the handicapped seating area and in chairs at the back of the church, and to any overflow seating outside of the church space.
- Clergy and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will sanitize their hands on entering the sanctuary and again after their own reception of the Eucharist. All ministers will wear masks while distributing Holy Communion.
- We strongly recommend that you receive Holy Communion in the hand.
 - You may not wear gloves while receiving; you may not receive the Eucharist in a disposable item such as a cup, tissue, or plate.
 - If you choose to receive Communion on the tongue, the minister will sanitize his or her hands before distributing Holy Communion to the next person.
- The Precious Blood will not be distributed at this time.
- Keep your face mask on while the minister holds up the Sacred Host and says, "The Body of Christ." Reply, "Amen," and then remove your face mask to receive Communion.



Post Mass

- Disposable liturgy guides will be available at Sunday Masses. Please deposit the guides in the blue recycling receptacles as you exit.
- Church bulletins are available both before and after Mass. You may also access our bulletin online.
