- Looking into hosting a 3-day conference the week of July 26-30 onsite at SJB. Doing it onsite at SJB is due to the Reach More Live Conference at Notre Dame being canceled because of COVID restrictions. More information to come.

- RCIC/Sacramental Catch up for Catholic.
 - Sr. Leonarda has been working with 4 families who are getting their children ready for Sacraments. There are 9 children total who will be receiving sacraments in June.
 - On June 2nd, we will have 5 receiving 1st Confession. On the Feast of Corpus Christ, June 6th, we will have 4 Baptisms, and 9 1st Communions. Ages range from 5-16 years old.
- 1st Communion on May 1st and 2nd
 - 1st Communion was May 1 and 2. 33 students received Jesus for the first time in Holy Communion. Thanks to our volunteers who took photos.
- Lectio on the Lawn
 - This summer we will begin our first annual Lectio on the Lawn begins on Thursday on June 3 at 7-8 pm. We will offer it all summer long on Thursdays. No Lectio on the Lawn when we celebrate St. John's Feast Day on Thursday, June 24th.
 - Lectio on the Lawn will be a time of connecting with Scripture and Connecting to each other. Bring a lawn chair, bring your favorite summer beverage, and enter the upcoming Sunday Gospel reading. We will meet in the courtyard of the school.

 - NET Team goodbye and bonfire –
 - The NET team is gone for the year, we are so grateful for their ministry this year. It was so amazing to see at the goodbye bonfire so many of our students who were impacted by their ministry this year. We had about 50 students and more families, parishioners who attended the evening. It was a great way to wrap up the year.
