

From Lee Trembl, Director of Worship

In the Church, we hear the term liturgy used a lot. The Mass is referred to as a liturgy. Within the Mass, we have the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. What does liturgy mean exactly? Essentially, liturgy is the work of the people. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, “The liturgy is source of life first of all because it is the ‘work of Christ’ (CCC, 1071). In the second place, because ‘it is also an action of His Church’”.

The Mass, being a liturgy, is the source and summit of our lives. In the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Jesus gives his Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity to us in the form of bread and wine since He wants to intimately be united with us. However, the priest is not the only one offering the sacrifice. The laity, as the Mystical Body of Christ, play a role in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass through their baptism as priest, prophet, and king. While the laity do not have the sacrament of Holy Orders like an ordained priest, both the person of Christ the head, the priest in persona Christi Capitis, and the assembly, the Mystical Body of Christ, each have a unique role in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

However, some of the faithful are called to serve a specific liturgical ministry. These ministries include being a Minister of the Word (Lector), Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, Usher, Greeter, Sacristan, Altar Server, Crucifer, Candle Bearer, Thurifer, or Choir Member. These ministries are not only a great privilege to serve in, but a calling, which is a great way to live out our core value of reliance on prayer, due to the integral nature of prayer with the Mass.

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, “The faithful, moreover, should not refuse to serve the People of God gladly whenever they are asked to perform some particular ministry or function in the celebration.” This further emphasizes the importance and privilege of serving the Church as a liturgical minister.




