

A Message from Deacon Gary



"Be Restored by Relying on Prayer"

Prayer is the beautiful reality of communicating with God, our Creator and Lord, and meditating on the immensity of his love for us. Fr. Thomas Dubay noted in his book, *Prayer Primer*, "Human beings are meant to be alive and vibrant. full of wonder, and happiness – which is exactly what Scripture promises to those who

embrace God's word fully. This is what the saints experience, what people who have a deep prayer life know to be the case."

Jesus came that we may have life to the full (Jn 10:10). Prayer is so much more than a duty or another activity in our day, it is a precious privilege with unimaginable blessings. Thus, Reliance on Prayer is a key focal area for restoring us personally and as a faith community. Last week we focused on Praying the Mass, and the contributions made by numerous liturgical ministers, who help make our liturgies beautiful.

This week, we are highlighting additional opportunities for people to engage in prayer. Afterall, like any loving relationship, spending quality time together is important, and variety is the spice of life! God delights in the many ways we come to him in prayer.

The Rosary is prayed before Mass on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday each week. On Oct 7 we celebrated the Memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary, which commemorated the miraculous Christian fleet's victory over the larger Ottoman fleet. The Rosary is a powerful prayer!

Continuing with our Lady, Legion of Mary is a ministry of prayer and service. From Servant of God, Frank Duff who founded the Legion of Mary, "The object of the Legion of Mary is the greater glory of God through holiness of its members developed by prayer and active cooperation, under Church guidance, in Mary's work of crushing the head of Satan and advancing the reign of Jesus Christ. For those unable to attend regular meetings and works of service, there is an Auxiliary membership which assists the legion by their commitment to prayer.

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy is prayed after the Monday Mass. Every day of the week at 3:00 PM we pray the Litany of Restoration, which concludes with a Novena of Restoration. Please join on Facebook.

We offer in our Adoration chapel, perpetual adoration of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Come pray with the Lord for an hour in silent serenity, bringing your life and worship to him who loves us beyond our imaginings. The Lord is never outdone in generosity, so people committing to one hour each week have experienced numerous blessings. Come and see for yourself by signing up this weekend.

Intercessory Prayer Ministry is offered monthly after two of the weekend Masses in the Chapel of the Angels. This is private and confidential prayer with a team of trained intercessors who will guide you as you seek the Lord for healing, strength, and victory for any area of your life, or for those you love. Come and be restored in His love.

May we all be restored to fullness of life by relying on prayer, Amen!


