

Due to the overwhelming requests for Mass intentions:



Spiritual Adoption

gans. During the second month, baby teeth form and fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose. lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. Forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. This little one can


