From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain



"For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

~Mark 10:45

During the Synod process, parishioners have been sharing about ways that they have encountered Christ. Several have shared that they encounter Christ while serving others. That is inspiring to think about. Rather than thinking "I am bringing them Jesus through service," thinking "I am encountering Jesus in this act of service." In that moment of encounter, Christ restores us.

As we begin the month of November, we focus on the core value of "Generous Spirit: Being Restored through Service to Others." As we live out of a generous spirit, we encounter Christ in the people we see. We live out of a generous spirit in so many beautiful ways through service and building up Christ's kingdom. Those encounters with Christ restore us to life, as we are given hope when we see joy, gratitude, and love in those we serve.

In our first reading this weekend, the widow of Zarephath lives out of a generous spirit and serves Elijah. In doing so, the Lord strengthens her and provides for her even in her poverty. She thinks that she will starve to death as she feeds him the last of her flour. However, God works a miracle through her service. Her flour jar does not go empty until the drought was over. As a result of serving others and living out of a generous spirit, the widow is *Restored to Life*!

How is God calling you to serve Him? Even though service requires sacrifice on our part, God will reward and restore us to life. This weekend we have many people serving others by helping with the Turkey Dinner. We just had our St. Vincent de Paul Food Drive and many serve others through donating food and money to help those in need. We had a Knights of Columbus Pancake Breakfast last weekend, and the Knights generously served our community. Our Assisting Better Lives for the Elderly group has been raking yards and helping those in need with yard work. Our Food Shelf continues to serve hungry families every week. Those serving in liturgical ministries like greeters and ushers, lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, help us to pray the Mass every week. Those serving on the New Member Welcome Committee help new visitors get plugged into our parish life. Many people teach the faith as part of Family Formation, Sunday School, or Small Group leaders. The Council of Catholic Women serve food and assists where needed around the parish. Commission Members serve by sharing their expertise to help make SJB a brighter light of Christ.

There are so many ways to serve Christ here at SJB! Although you may think that you will be giving more than you receive, trust that God has more in store for you than you can imagine! Christ will encounter you in your acts of service and *Restore you to Life*!





Spiritual Adoption

Your spiritually adopted baby is in his or her second month in the womb. The developing baby is now called a fetus, which is Latin for "little one". He or she is making rapid progress developing all external and internal or-

gans. During the second month, baby teeth form and fingers and toes are developing. Ears. lips nose. and tongue can now be clearly seen. Brain waves can be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. Forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. This little one can



now suck his or her thumb. By eight weeks all body systems are present. Your baby's mother most likely knows she is pregnant by now, or she will soon be finding out. Pray for

her. Visit the Spiritual Adoption Table in St. Paul Plaza for a larger picture of what your baby looks like.

Due to the overwhelming requests for Mass intentions:

- A Mass intention can be requested no more than 3 months out. For example, if you would like a Mass intention for September, the earliest you can request that date is June 1. Please keep in mind your preferred date may not be available.
- Only 2 Mass intentions per person, per month will be taken.


