While we are restoring our spiritual life, we will continue to find ways to grow and build community through our Catholic School's Week celebrations and Wines to Wishes fundraising event.

As we enter the new year, we look forward to more opportunities to continue to restore life to our school and families. Be assured of our prayers as you are restored to life and please pray for us this Advent season.




**Updating of Youth Room**: carpeting, paint, furniture. These improvements will make the room more functional and attractive for our growing numbers of participating youth – \$10,000.

## **Maintenance/Physical Plant**

- **Restroom Upgrade** new countertop and sinks with hands free faucets in upper level Pastoral Center restrooms - \$18,000
- Stations of the Cross Garden (south side of the church) replacement of deteriorating boards and nameplates \$3,000
- New Bobcat Skid Steer. Our current Bobcat is old, has limited load capacity, and can be difficult to maneuver. We use the Bobcat for a variety tasks, including unloading semi-truck deliveries and snow removal. \$30,000
- A Scissor Lift to be used in the church, St. Paul Plaza or school gymnasium for access to high areas. Presently we borrow or rent a lift, and we use ladders in places where a lift might serve better. \$25,000



**Portable Stand-Up Desks** to provide ergonomic upgrade for staff workspaces – 2 requested; \$200 each
