From the Senior Associate Pastor: Father Doug Ebert

“Where is the newborn king of the Jews?

*We saw his star at its rising
and have come to do him homage.”*

-The Magi in Matthew 2:2

While attending the seminary many years ago, a fellow seminarian made a presentation to a group of college students about ideal family life and Church teachings. As he would later describe in his presentation, he told of a near-insurgency in the classroom, as some students challenged his sensitivity and were offended by his support of the sort of family life unknown to many of them.

We often do not live in ideal situations and none of us are perfect. Nevertheless, we have the power to imagine what perfection can be and to seek betterment. Taking offense at how things could be, simply because they are not, is diminishment of our God-given freedom to seek what is good.

God has given us the Christmas gift of His Son born of the Virgin Mary who was married to Joseph. We honor the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. We give thanks to God, our Father, for Christ Jesus, His Son, who came to redeem us and make all things perfect.

The situation of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph was hardly the ideal. Matthew’s genealogy of Jesus includes some people of dubious character. Their family life involved a premature and unexpected pregnancy. When learning of this, Mary rejoiced at the angel Gabriel’s message and trusted God’s plan having no idea how it would all unfold. Joseph, a just man of good will, was reluctant to harm or embarrass Mary when he could only assume the worst. How relieved he must have been when an angel of the Lord explained what was happening in a dream! Having no idea what was next, Joseph also trusted God’s messenger. After lacking the resources for “suitable” birthing accommodations, the Holy Family would later flee anonymously into a foreign land to escape a hostile King Herod who was offended by the baby’s royal attention.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph’s familial love and faith helped them through their earthly trials. Joseph enabled a home for his stepson to mature and prepare for His redemptive mission; from this Holy Family emerged our Lord and Savior who came to redeem sinners in universally imperfect human situations.

After Jesus’ Resurrection and Ascension into Heaven, God sent the same Holy Spirit who enabled His Son’s birth to dwell among us, keeping Christ Jesus present until His return in glory.

We have been born with the gift of our time to grow in love and to seek perfection. In Baptism, we are initiated as God’s adopted children. As unique members of God’s family, we are invited to seek our eternal inheritance through the saving power of our heavenly Father’s Son, Christ Jesus. As we follow Christ Jesus to redemption and deliverance from evil, along the way we will find hints of perfection in loving relationships.

We, who pursue Christ’s perfection in our imperfect world, may be offensive to some, but we are the present-day holy family seeking the Holy Spirit’s aid to help us to continue loving those we offend as we pursue the joyful hope and promise of our faith.
