From the Parochial Administrator: Father Andy Jaspers



"He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free..." ~ Luke 4:18-9

My joy in serving you grows each day, dear friends. It amazes and edifies me to hear the stories about where you've been over the years since I was last at St. John's. Many of you have overcome tremendous obstacles in your personal or family life. And many more have found God's presence when the sky seemed darkest.

I have grown accustomed to stories like these in my hospital ministry and in ministry to people in the military. Sometimes, families and individuals thrive under strain. Others struggle to see the light.

The Christian spiritual tradition sees our growth in freedom to be one of increasing detachment from obstacles to our freedom. It also involves our growing attachment to the things of God. Our immersion in the Word Proclaimed and the Holy Eucharist are our chief sources of freedom. Some of us have the gift to steadily grow in freedom through education and consistent prayer. Others struggle to make any time for such things because of real, persistent burdens.

Three widespread enemies of our freedom are addictions, momentous debt, and radical instability in couple's lives with each other. It is a gift to be in a parish that restores people to growth by addressing these foundational conflicts in our lives.

Our Cana Dinner on Feb. 12 will be an inspiration to many of our couples, including those who are seeking greater stability and joy in their relationships. As part of my training as an Air Force chaplain, I look forward to offering Prep 8.0, which is a workshop on couples' communication that enables better understanding and problem solving. And parishioners who have overcome enormous personal debt will soon be offering Financial Peace University—a series that helps those of us with considerable debt find our way to financial peace and freedom.

God's first invitation to his son's birth was to the shepherds—people who were landless, rough, and lonely. We have likely all been in this condition at some point in our lives. Our Lord and His Church are eager to meet us here and concretely restore us to growth.

The annual MCCL March for Life will take place at 12 noon on Saturday, January 22, on the State Capitol grounds in St. Paul. The March for Life will be preceded by a prayer service at the St. Paul Cathedral from 10:30 am to 11:30 am. St. John's will be providing a charter bus to these events on the 22nd, sponsored by the SJB Knights and the Respect Life group.

A signup sheet for the charter bus will be available on the Harvest Table starting on Saturday, January 15. The bus will leave St. John's from the West church entrance at 9:45 am on the 22nd and drop passengers at the Cathedral in time for the 10:30 am Prayer Service. Participants can also ride the bus to the Capitol at 11:30 am or walk to the March for Life, depending on the weather. There is no charge to take the bus.

The charter bus will depart the Capitol between 12:45 pm and 1:00 pm and return to St. John's by 1:15 pm.

Spiritual Adoption Update

Your spiritually adopted baby is entering his or her fourth month in the womb. The baby's brain has begun maturing - a process that will continue until he or she is about 14 years old. The eyelids are now sealed shut and will re-open at seven months. The taste buds are working. Nutrients consumed by his or her mother are passed

on to the baby within an hour or two. Three hundred quarts of fluid a day are sent to the baby via the umbilical cord. Fine hair begins to grow on the head, eyebrows and eyelashes. Facial expressions similar to the baby's parents can be seen at this time. This month REM's (rapid eye movements) have been recorded - a sign of dreaming!



This Feast is also known as Candlemas Day; a day in which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the light of the world. So, too, those in consecrated life are called to reflect the light of Jesus Christ to all peoples.
