#### Introducing Katie Coughlin and Alice Schwantes, Natural Family Planning Practitioners!

Saint John the Baptist welcomes two new resources to the parish. Katie and Alice are each trained to teach women and couples how to track fertility using Natural Family Planning (NFP).

NFP is the natural and scientific way of observing a woman's signs of fertility in order to achieve and avoid a pregnancy. It teaches that fertility and sexuality are gifts that are to be appreciated instead of being suppressed. Additionally, it is an acceptable method of family planning according to church teaching.

NFP can also assist women in uncovering the underlying causes of premenstrual syndrome (PMS), pelvic pain caused by endometriosis, repeat miscarriages, and infertility. With the use of natural, cooperative healthcare, women can often find relief and answers.

#### **World Day for Consecrated Life**

World Day for Consecrated Life will be celebrated in the Church on Wednesday, February 2, and in parishes over the weekend of February 5 - 6. #### Thank you for your generosity!

- a. Our parishioners remain committed to living out of a generous spirit. While slightly behind budget, Sunday Giving is up almost 3% over last year. Thank you!
- b. School Tuition Revenue and Other School Revenue are both up significantly due to further enrollment increases in our school, as well as in our preschool and daycare.
- c. Salary & Benefits Parish remains below budget but is up over last year due primarily to certain staff additions and the impact of pandemic-driven furloughs of part-time staff in 2020-21.
- d. Both Salaries & Benefits School and School Operating Expenses are up over last year and budget primarily due increased school enrollment.

While slightly behind the strong results we saw last year, Revenue Minus Expense remains comfortably ahead of budget. Overall, our financial condition remains good.


