# From Jessica Balzarini, Director of Parish Life



"Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, whose hope is in the Lord..." ~ Jeremiah 17:7

In our first reading today, we see the stark contrast between a life that is cursed and a life that is blessed. It shows us a real truth about a life that trusts in human beings and one whose heart is turned away from the Lord. The words used are vivid: barren, empty lava waste. Equally as striking, we see a blessed life as one who trusts in the Lord and has hope. A blessed life brings life giving water, living without fear. A life full of spiritual and physical health is a life that will bear much fruit.

Only Jesus can restore us to life and provide the way to the blessed life that is proclaimed to us today. In God's beautiful design, He uses each of us to help one another find the way to Him. Lent is just around the corner, and there will be many opportunities and resources to help you grow in order to be restored and blessed.

One suggestion is - don't do Lent alone. Think about joining a small group! If you are like me, you may have tried to pray more or read Scripture for Lent, only to peter out and fall short of your goals. A small group gives you a supportive and encouraging community that can make your Lent so much more meaningful, and Easter that much more joyful.

These small groups are designed to draw adults into a friendship with Jesus and one another. There are no teachers or experts in small groups. We learn and grow together. We have trained parishioners to facilitate open-ended conversations that will:

- t Discuss life and faith
- t Reflect on God's Word together, applying the Sunday readings to daily life
- † Seek God together
- t Pray for and with one another

#### **INTERCESSORY PRAYER MINISTRY**


