From the Parochial Administrator: Father Andy Jaspers

*“Love your enemies,
do good to those who hate you...”*
~ Luke 6:27-28

Have you ever had enemies? Have you ever been persecuted?

And do you know the most distinctive moral teaching of Christianity? You may think it is the Golden Rule—do unto others as you would have them do unto you. But one can find a teaching like this in Buddhism and the Analects of Confucius. What you will not find there or anywhere else is the command to love your enemies. Only Jesus teaches this.

Is it wise or even possible to love your enemies? It is easy to love our friends. With a little more difficulty, we can love family members. But how can we love strangers? By definition, we have nothing in common with them, and love requires some common ground. And to love enemies? An enemy aims at your destruction. So, is not loving an enemy loving your destruction? We have to confess that we have neither the reason nor the power to love enemies.

But as Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI said in his encyclical, “God is love,” if God commands us to do something and it is beyond our power, He must give us the power to accomplish this.

Having experienced some persecution some years ago, I made a silent retreat. I hoped to find some solace. And as I immersed myself in the scene of Jesus’ scourging at the pillar on the way to the Cross, I noticed that he was loving his torturers in the midst of the Passion. All along the Passion, he is willing the good of his enemies—loving them, despite their treatment of him.

I took up a place next to Our Savior and experienced my own lashing. And suddenly, Our Lord filled me with a surging love for my persecutors. Indeed, I had gratitude for them, because they were the occasion to vault me to a higher form of love—loving my enemies.

I pray that as you enter Lent this year, you can let no daylight in between you and Our Savior in His Passion. Great love is to be found there.

Message from Office of Worship

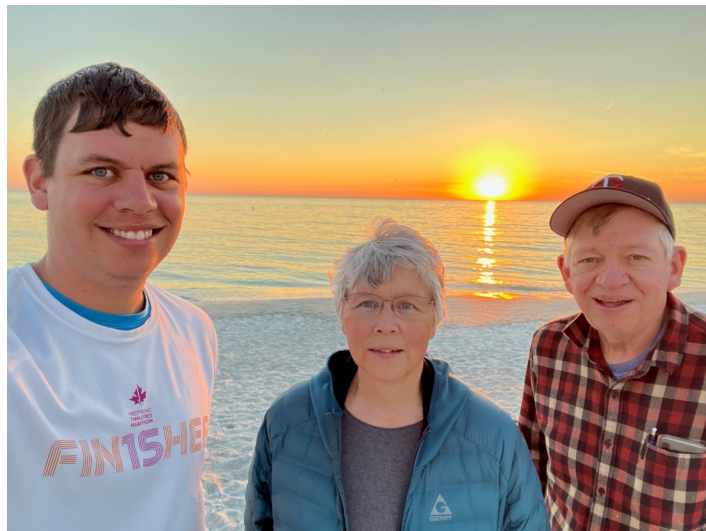

Forming our students in the Catholic Faith, which helps them understand how to live life to the full, is of utmost importance.
