Holy, Holy, Holy! In Hebrew they did not have a word for holiest, rather they would repeat the word three times to communicate the superlative. Today, the people of Jerusalem point out that Jesus is the holiest! They welcome him with open arms as he enters their city. They are hopeful for a new Exodus, that he will lead them to better times. As we enter into the Holy, Holy, Holy (holiest) week of the year, Christ journeys with us. It is an opportunity for us to develop greater holiness in our lives. We do that through our reliance on prayer throughout this week. If you have never attended the Triduum liturgies; I invite you to do so. It will truly be an opportunity for you to grow in your relationship with the Lord as we reflect deeply on the life, death and resurrection of Christ. My favorite parts of Holy Week include celebrating the Eucharist on Holy Thursday as we participate in the Last Supper of Christ. I also love the veneration of the Cross on Good Friday. I love the Easter vigil as the Church is lit by the light of candles at the beginning of the Mass. 
## Sabbatical Conclusion







Sitarz's grandfather who made the first three kettles. Bob's father made the next three kettles and Bob Sitarz made the last three of the nine kettles that are still used today.
