

From the Director of Worship, Lee Treml



"John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit. ." ~ Acts of the Apostles 1:5

When we enter the church, one of the first things we do is make the Sign of the Cross from the Holy Water in the baptismal font. This reminds us of our Christian Baptism. After that, we genuflect towards the tabernacle as a sign of reverence towards the real presence of our Lord in the Eucharist. During the Mass itself, we stand, sit or kneel throughout. These are examples of both gestures and postures. Gestures involve movement, such as the Sign of the Cross, whereas postures are stationary positions, such as standing. Both gestures and postures help us dive deeper into what is going on in the Mass—each with its own significance.

Among the postures, the three most common ones are standing, sitting and kneeling. When we stand, it traditionally is seen as a sign of respect and readiness, which is why we stand in processions during Mass, since it honors Christ, the priest symbolizing Christ, as he enters. The proclamation of the Gospel is another significant place where we stand, since in the proclamation of the Gospel we believe that it is Jesus himself who is speaking to the Church. Standing for the Gospel also highlights its importance over when we sit for the preceding readings. In that case, sitting would reflect a posture of listening and meditation. Finally, kneeling traditionally has been the penitential posture, which later became a posture of adoration in the Middle Ages. Kneeling also signifies humility, since we are proclaiming our lowly state before God.

Among the gestures, here are some important ones that are often overlooked. Bowing when the name of Jesus, the Blessed Virgin Mary and the saint of the day is mentioned. Genuflecting towards the tabernacle with your right knee, not left. Traditionally, we would genuflect with our right knee towards a king. Also, the significance of the importance of the right is shown with Jesus sitting at the right hand of the Father. During Mass, we always bow towards the altar and we do not genuflect towards the tabernacle, since the current sacrifice is taking place at the altar, it is given priority during the Liturgy. That is why you may notice the lectors, cantors, and clergy always bowing towards the altar and not the tabernacle. However, there are a few places where genuflecting is allowed during the Liturgy, which are at the beginning and end of Mass, before the clergy enter the sanctuary and when they leave. Also, it includes the three genuflections for the priest during the Eucharistic Prayer.


St. John the Baptist Cemetery Price Increases
