"Testímony of Beíng Restored to Lífe through Relíance on Prayer"

A Visible Sign

On Sunday, April 3, our Gospel reading came from John 11:1-45. Often referred to as the Gospel of Lazarus, in which it had been four days since Lazarus had died and upon reaching the tomb, Martha, the dead man's sister, says to Jesus, "Lord, by now there will be a stench; he has been dead for four days." Then Jesus says, "Did I not tell you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?" I've heard this gospel passage many times over the last 40 years, but today I now understand it in a personal way, having partaken in another miracle glorifying God!

Just past midnight on April 4th, I collapsed on the kitchen floor from a heart attack (a myocardial infarction resulting from a coronary artery becoming completely blocked). At this point I had nearly zero chance of living, with some experts saying that I had a 1% chance of survival. But what do the experts know about the power of prayer? Thanks be to God, my writing this article means that many who prayed, and some experts, received a valuable lesson on the power of prayer.

The outpouring of prayers began as soon as my wife Carrie heard my fall and while frantically calling '9-1-1' she administered CPR to my lifeless body, continuing onto trained responders who found a pulse and rushed me to the hospital, onto my family members rising from sleep to come to the ICU, onto the hospital staff who knew my life was nearly gone, onto those priests and religious who prayed with my family at the hospital or who gathered others to pray, onto a network of family, friends and prayer warriors who swiftly notified many in those early hours, onto the great parishes and schools of St. John the Baptist, St. Charles Borromeo and The Church of the Epiphany where they prayed in the classrooms, at home, and in daily Mass, and onto the many others across our Archdiocese, across the country and even across the oceans.

Without a doubt God heard YOUR prayers! And He chose to answer YOUR prayers with a visible sign, a living reminder. Lazarus spent 4 days in the tomb. God raised me from my "tomb" (yes, with a stench) after 5 days on April 9th, which "God-incidentally" is the eve of my 40th anniversary of being baptized into our beautiful Catholic faith! (I got goosebumps when that realization came to me during this writing!) Throughout the bible, how many times does He use the number 40 to signify the end of a period of trial and a new beginning? (It's something like 150 times!) In my case, after 40 years a "dead" man rises and begins a new life. We often hear Our Father called "the Author of Life", but I'd like to expand that because it's clear He even writes a great script for a movie!

One hope I have from this miracle healing is that each of us will recall it each time we are moved or asked to pray for someone, reminding ourselves that God always answers our prayers. Another hope is that we will encourage others (friends, family, angels and saints, the Immaculate Heart of Mary) to join in our prayers, recalling the great power of unification in prayer. Together with these intercessions Jesus does hear us! He may not answer with such a clearly visible sign, but He most certainly will answer in love, glorifying God in ways that we mere mortals may not see or understand.

In closing, THANK YOU!!! Thank you for YOUR prayers and get-well cards. If not for YOUR prayers, I would not be writing this now. And my family and those many caregivers would not be my heroes. From my vantage point, I can clearly see how the parish of St. John the Baptist lives out the Core Value of Reliance on Prayer – thanks be to God!







- We need two Host Homes for the week of Saturday, July 30-Saturday, August 6. The Host Homes can not have anyone living in the home who is under 18 years of age.

SJB Year in Review Highlights for 2021-2022 "Restored to Life"

Willingness to Grow:

- t Increased participation for Faithfully Fit, Young at Heart, and Widows and Widowers group.
- † Time was set aside at each monthly Worship Commission session to study and discuss the "Constitution of the Sacred Liturgy."
- Helped prepare for 83 Baptisms (including several of our new school children) 60 children for 1st Communions,
 42 Confirmations. Of the 83 Baptisms, 13 children were prepared to receive the Sacrament through RCIC.
- + Prepared 10 couples for the Sacrament of Marriage.
- t Encouraged and promoted participation in Synod Small Group Consultation process, over 150 people attended.
- + Sent two delegates to the Archdiocesan Synod as well as several other staff members and parishioners who helped facilitate the event.
- + Aided 61 families to live family discipleship at home through the Family Formation program.
- + Endowment funds were used to help fund Capital projects that beautify our buildings and better serve our ministries.
- t Trained new Altar Servers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Lectors, and Ushers.
- ⁺ The school had a 91.2% retention rate last year. The school has had an enrollment increase of 39.5% in 3 years, almost twice the Archdiocesan average.
- t Revamped the Families Helping Families event and had the highest turnout of school families ever.
- † The school created multiple new committees, including a parent/teacher Communications Committee and a Catholic Culture Committee.
- t 13 additional disciples went through the Reach More Mission training for 50 total leaders trained.
- + 19 small groups met during our Lent 2022 Season with 150 participants reflecting on God's Word and being transformed.
- t 10 small groups meet regularly throughout the ministry year.
- t devoted averaged 50 participants monthly throughout this past year.
- t Catholic Watchmen averaged about 40 participants monthly throughout this past year.
- t Circle of Women met weekly from January through April with about 25 participants on average.
- † Men's Fellowship met weekly throughout the year with about 20 participants on average.
- t Over 70 new member registrations have been received since July 1st, 2021.
- t Second largest parish to partner with Damascus with 70 youth attending Catholic Youth Summer Camp.
- t 2021 had the largest Totus Tuus group in SJB history.
- t Resumed parish library after being closed during the pandemic.
