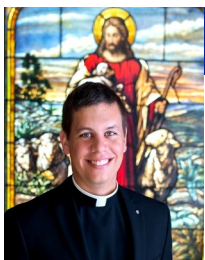

From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain

We are now in a routine with the school year and there is a lot of life and energy around our campus. I am excited that we filled the full-time positions in the school and we are better able to serve our school families. Family Formation is off to a great start, and we have the largest numbers we have seen in several years. 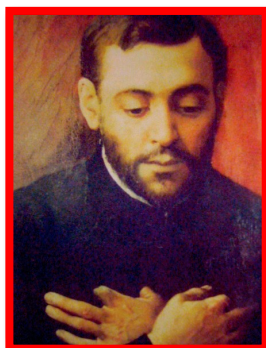

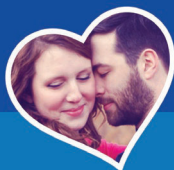

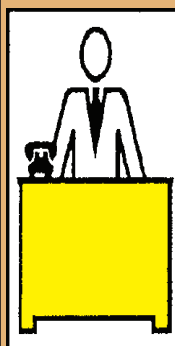
