Live Report by Claire Brostrom, RM Coordinator, 1/17/23, 5:30pm

- In my 6th month of the role Reach More Mission Coordinator
- Overarching goal: to equip lay parishioners in the heart and habits of discipleship... that they might discern their personal apostolate: those in their family, neighborhood, job, or parish whom they feel called to grow in faith with. The training group places a special emphasis on facilitating a small group, since that is a historically successful avenue for building relationships.
- My personal goal: to build relationships these first months...attending Devoted, new parishioner events, retreat, etc. My main hope is to shift the culture to one that really prioritizes discipleship relationships. Have seen improved response to my invites for coffee/one on one check-ins.
- I met with each of the existing leaders before Christmas; and already feel that I have much more relational collateral going into the spring!

Updates

I began by attending the summer mission training group that Jessica was finishing (7 women)

- Have since been leading a training group with Neil Steffl which began in October. 5 participants, finishing the training next Monday night. At least 3 of the 5 are already actively inviting for small groups that they will base out of the parish.
- Our spring is looking optimistic with 4 training groups running! Myself on Thursday evenings,
 Jessica for staff on Monday afternoons, Neil with his Wed AM group, and Michele Stori with her women's group
- I've been most excited by the depth of this most recent training group; the EC material is amazing; and Neil and I are experienced SG facilitators...but we've said so many times how spoiled we feel with this group going above and beyond. I get the sense that there are many parishioners who are desiring to take the next step in being a missionary disciple, but perhaps intimidated by the commitment. And I've just been thrilled at how these initially tentative "yeses have really deeply committed to attending group, doing the daily prayer companion, and some seeking spiritual direction and retreats outside of what we offer.

Next 2 weeks

- Leader Huddle next Wednesday evening: "When God Feels Distant" & Lenten plan.

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- Lenten small group publicity weekend 28/29th; last year had ~200 in Lenten small groups...hoping to see great participation again this year.
- Next Step for women who were on weekend retreat -> then inviting to Lenten groups.
 Looking ahead
- With the focus on small group training from Synod, we foresee not running a Reach More training group in the fall, and following the guidance from the Archdiocese (using Brotherhood of Hope content)

Numbers

- Have trained 45 leaders; 39 actively engaged with groups currently.
- Expect 22 more trained at the end of the spring session, so a total of <u>72 leaders to date!</u>
- Attendance at Huddles has been about 30%...have tried all different days, seems inevitable with people's varied schedules.

Discussion

- What did we do before your position was created Claire?
 - Neil is remarkable, he's a volunteer yet he is like a full-time position in his role.
 - Jessica was amazing! She managed this whole RM program along with her other job duties. Last year she trained leaders and had over 200 people joined small groups during Lent alone.
 - This is a remarkable program, Jessica, Director of Office of Discipleship and Missions at the time, with Neil started and grew this ministry. That is how my part time position came about.
 - Claire explained they all reach out 3 times/year with all leaders active or inactive. The Trinity...we meet to keep our leaders. It's like if you have season ticket holders for a sport, you really want to keep that group coming back year after year!
 - Question was asked of Claire, "What do you need?"

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Written Report – Jen Livermont, Coordinator for Discipleship for Families

Childcare – In addition to our regular programs that we provide childcare for, we will also provide childcare for the Reconciliation Retreat and Reconciliation Sacrament in January.

Sunday School – We had our Sunday School Christmas program on December 18th after the 10:30am Mass in St. Joseph's Hall. We had a packed house, and the kids did a great job! Sunday School is starting back up on January 15th.

Catholic Kids Bulletins – We are and have been printing 80 Catholic Kids Bulletins every weekend. We will increase that amount to 100 to see if we have leftovers. We ran out of bulletins before 10:30 Mass began this week. I want to see if that was just because of the Journey to the Inn or if we really need to increase the bulletins. If we have quite a few leftovers with printing 100, I will only do that for weeks when Sunday School is not in session.

Family Formation – We added a student to Family Formation in December. Our new total is 109. Our topic for the month is The Bible: Our Family's Story. Pat Millea will give the parent talk and lead the families in a Lectio Divina on the Baptism of the Lord along with parents blessing each child at the baptismal font while the child makes a personal "yes" to Jesus.

Epiphany Blessing Bags – We gave out 300 Epiphany Blessing Bags as well as 240 Holy Water bottles.

Journey to the Inn – What a huge success! The Knights of Columbus served over 400 people dinner within one hour and we had a families and groups that came after dinner, so this was by far our largest crowd. We had a miniature donkey which was a fun new addition to our animals this year. We also added in Christmas carols back in St. Joseph's Hall for everyone to enjoy during the cookies and cocoa (~550 cookies & cocoa) at the end of the night. Lots of parishioners invited people to join them here so there were lots of new faces, so it was a great evangelizing opportunity.

 - o 1 girls d-group is currently forming for 6th graders.
- Grade Level Retreats
 - \circ I am collaborating with the religion teachers to plan a retreat for each grade (6-8th)
 - o We are hoping to get parents involved as small group leaders.
 - We will stay on site.

Written Report - Jessica Balzarini, Director of Parish Life

SJB Retreats for Men and Women Awaken. The Women's retreat is this coming weekend January 13-15. We are completely full. Please keep 40 participants and the team of 10 in your prayers this weekend as they encounter the Lord more deeply this weekend and build community with each other. The men's Core Team has begun planning the March 3-5 retreat and praying for those called to attend.

Synod Evangelization Team has been officially formed and the names have been submitted to the Archdiocese. The team will attend a Kick-off event in January with formation and training to begin in February. The team will participate in the School of Discipleship through the Catechetical Institute.

Written Report – Jill Fink, Director of Catechesis

Baptism: Class on January 9. Teaching Couples are incorporating new elements in the class format.

First Sacraments: Parents are working through their final Home Lessons. Check Point for December Home lessons was January 7 at Journey to the Inn. The First Reconciliation Retreat is Sunday, January 22 with an altering start of 2:00pm or 2:45pm. The retreat will have individual time for parent/child to work through some review materials and tour of the confessional as well as large group time with Jill Fink and Fr. Paul. First Reconciliation Celebration is Saturday, January 28 at 9am in the church. Several priests will be available to hear confessions for the children and families. The grade 2 catechists and schoolteachers are assisting at the retreat and celebration.

RCIC: 8 baptized children celebrated their first Reconciliation at the Advent Reconciliation Service on December 18. The next Family Meeting is Sunday, January 8 at 9:30-10:15 for check in, review of Christian Life Unit and looking ahead to First Communion. Students will receive classroom lessons

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according to their age in Family Formation, with Sarah Wilder in middle school or with Miss Fink in the school.

Becoming Catholic RCIA: Classes continue in the sacramental unit on Thursday nights. We had a new catechumen work with a sponsor and now is attending the class. Students will learn about all the sacraments and have a tour of the sacristy and go over the Mass.

Formation Parent Program: January Formation Night is January 11 on the topic of The Bible: Our Family's Story. Pat Millea will be presenting the Parent Program. He will also encourage families on their Faith Plan with his series from Synod at Home. A parent/child large group prayer service is planned to engage families with pondering scripture together and remembering their baptism. February Formation Night is Wed., February 1. Fr. Joseph will present The Holy Spirit: Power and Strength for the Family.

Marriage Ministry: Four couples in RCIA are piloting the Witness to Love Convalidation curriculum. Mentor couples continue to work with engaged couples.

Adult Ministry: Jill will be serving on the Synod Evangelization Team with the School of Discipleship.
