From Director of Catechesis: Jill Fink



"Then they opened their treasures and offered Him gifts" ~ Matthew 2: 11

Merry Christmas! Today is the feast of the Epiphany which marks the final day of the Christmas octave. Heading into Ordinary Time, we bring the work begun in Advent preparation through Christmas celebration. We worked to experience Emmanuel, God with us, in history, mystery, and majesty. Today is the last day the Church formally celebrates the history of the Nativity story but is it important to remember how Jesus comes to redeem and save us from our sins all year long.

We turn now to Emmanuel, God with us, in mystery where we look to the gift of seeing God in our current time. God is with us in many ways, but especially through the Church and her sacramental life. I love this time of year in sacramental preparation ministry. I join a team of catechists, sponsors, and catechists who accompany those of all ages being Called Forth to prepare for sacraments of Baptism, First Eucharist, Confirmation, Reconciliation, and Holy Matrimony. This preparation of faith will bring about a celebration this Easter season.

With Monday's feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we can meditate on the gift of Baptism. I love working with children and adults in preparing them for the sacrament of Baptism and highlighting all the many gifts of this sacrament. Primarily, this is the gift of God with us, the Good Shepherd calling, claiming, and signing us to Himself. We ponder the gift of water washing and purifying, the gift of light illuminating, the gift of being clothed in Christ, and the gift of anointing to Christian duties of Priest, Prophet, and King. We see in the Baptism of the Lord the great humility of Christ fulfilling righteousness by allowing John the Baptist to baptize Him and the reward of the Heaven's opening and the Father proclaiming His delight. At each baptism there is this same opening of the Heavens, the opening of the gifts of baptism and the delight of our trinitarian God welcoming this new relationship through the Church.

Lastly, we ponder Emmanuel, God with us, one day in majesty. We are a people who look to the East, to the rising Son, where one day God will be all in all, where his Kingdom will never end. We bring the gift of our lives to the Gift first

given to us, Jesus Christ. The prayer over the gifts today is a beautiful meditation: "Look with favor, Lord, we pray, on these gifts of your Church, in which are offered now not gold or frankincense or myrrh, but He who by them is proclaimed, sacrificed, and received, Jesus Christ. Who live and reigns for ever and ever. Amen."

As we are Called Forth into this new year, let us be Called Forth to receive the gift of Jesus Christ and in turn bring ourselves as a gift to Christ within the Church. Please continue to hold in prayer all our candidates preparing for sacraments this year.

Children: Count how many times the word "gift" is used in this reflection. Know that you are a gift and have so many gifts to bring to Christ and the Church.



Epiphany House Blessing

If you wish, you can celebrate Epiphany at home with a blessing using the initials of the magi's traditional names (Casper, Melchior, Balthasar), four crosses, and the new year's numerals.

Materials: a piece of chalk and a small container of holy water. Gather with family members, friends, and perhaps some neighbors at the front door.

Leader: In the (+) name of the Father, and of the

Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We sign this doorway with four crosses and the numerals of the new year.

[20 + C + M + B + 23]

Let us pray: May Christ bless this house!

ALL: Amen!

Each room of the house is sprinkled with holy water.

Living room:

Leader: Where two or three are gathered in your name, Lord, you are present. Bless this room, O Lord.

ALL: Amen! Kitchen:

Leader: Give us this day our daily bread.

Bless this room, O Lord.

ALL: Amen! *Dining room:*

Leader: Prepare us for the heavenly banquet.

Bless this room, O Lord.

ALL: Amen! Bedrooms:

Leader: Stay with us Lord, when night has come.

Bless this room, O Lord.

ALL: Amen! *Bathroom:*

Leader: Cleanse us from all sin. Bless this room, O Lord.

ALL: Amen!

All return to the front door to pray together.

Leader: Let us pray as Jesus taught us:

Our Father . . .

The leader sprinkles all present with holy water.

Leader: Bless this household through all days to come,

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, forever and ever.

ALL: Amen!
