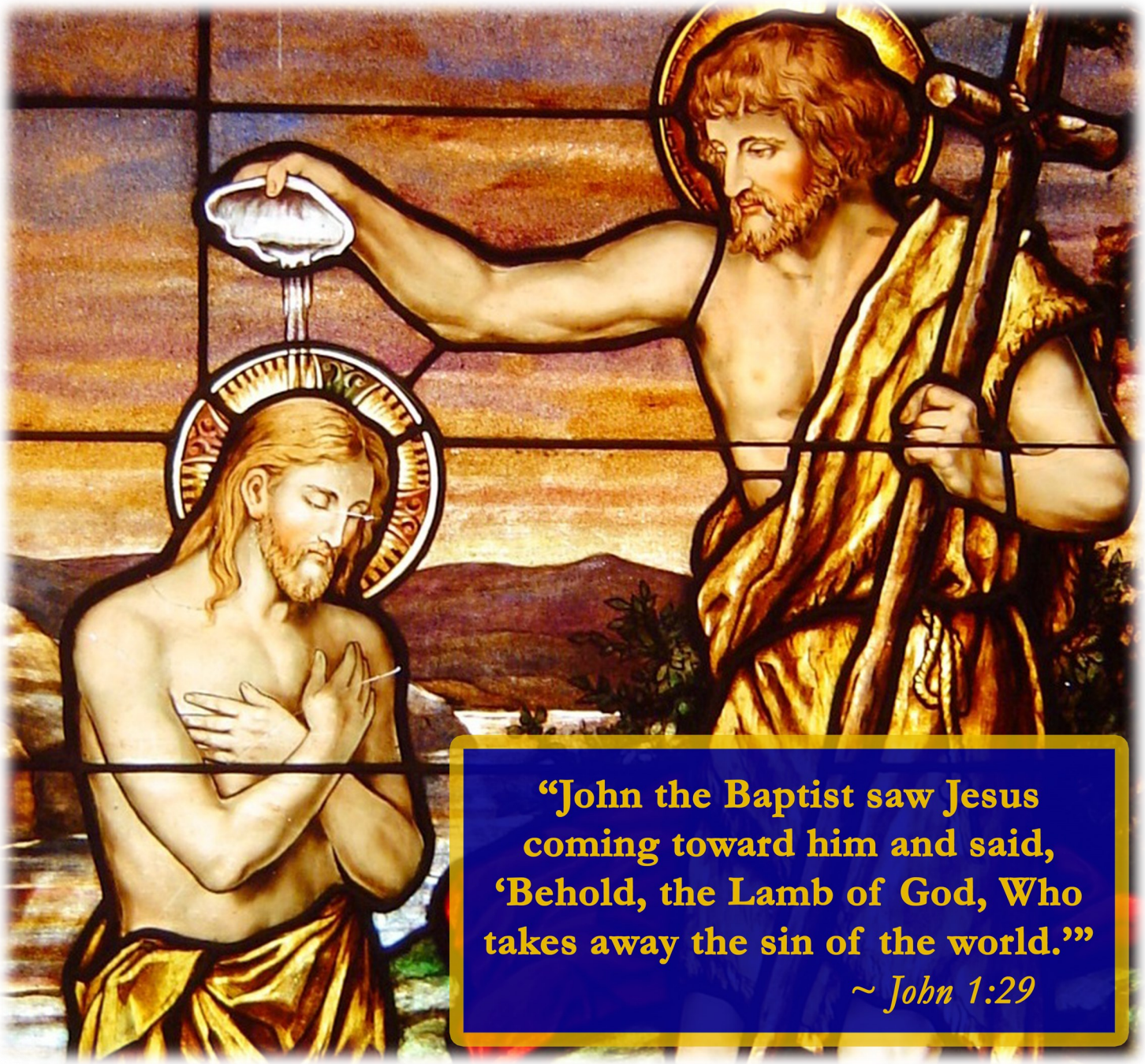

Chapel Renovation Update

Many of you will recall that we announced a renovation of our Chapel of the Angels in June 2022 with graphics and a description in the June 19 bulletin, and we displayed illustrations on an easel in St. Paul Plaza for several months afterward. There are many details to consider in renovating a worship space such as our chapel, and several staff members and parish leaders have considered options and refined our plans. With the leadership of our general contractor, parishioner Steve Arndorfer, we have put together a budget for the project and submitted a request to the Archdiocese for permission to move ahead.

Our estimate on expenses for this project is \$200,000, with the majority of those funds already received in donations and grants. Project expenses not covered by donation or grant will be covered by parish capital reserves. A detailed projection of project finances has been shared with both the Finance Commission and the Pastoral Leadership Council. The Finance Commission has recommended that we proceed with the project and the Pastoral Leadership Council has offered its input as well.

We anticipate receiving permission from the Archdiocese by the end of January, and plan to begin the renovation shortly after that. Thank you to all who have contributed meaningful input, time in reviewing plans, and financial gifts to support what will be a beautiful enhancement to our Chapel of the Angels! Church Interior Improvements Being Considered

In July the parish contracted with JT Egner Construction to conduct a need and budget analysis of improvements in our church interior in the following five categories:

1. Exterior: Masonry & Windows
2. Sanctuary Ceiling: smooth or textured surface, removal of acoustical spray
3. Upgrade to existing HVAC Systems, the central components of which date to 1968
4. Sound System
5. Refinishing Pews.

Josh Egner, owner of JT Egner Construction, prepared a report with information on these topics, which was reviewed and discussed in a joint meeting of the Administrative Services and Worship Commissions on December 13. A series of follow-up questions was generated and further review and discussion will yield a recommendation from these commissions regarding our priorities. Cost is also a factor, of course, and to do all of these things would add up to a significant expense. Our parish leaders will need to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance in making some very important decisions on our main church worship space and the resources available to us.

Our parish leaders are also aware that our school building is in need of significant improvement in several areas, such as restrooms, bleachers and carpeting, among other things. If we make significant improvements to our church interior we are also likely to include school improvements as a part of the overall project.

As decisions come closer to being made we will offer one or more open meetings for church and school families to learn more about our priorities and plans. Please watch future bulletins for continued updates and contact a staff member or one of our commission leaders for more information.

Sunday Giving July to December

Please watch a near future bulletin for a six-month revenue and expense report for the church and school. Before those reports are final, however, I can say that on the revenue side Sunday Giving for those six months was over our budgeted projection! Our budgeted income for Sundays & Holy Days, including Christmas, was \$1.177 million, and your gifts exceeded that number! Thank you all for your continued and amazing generosity!

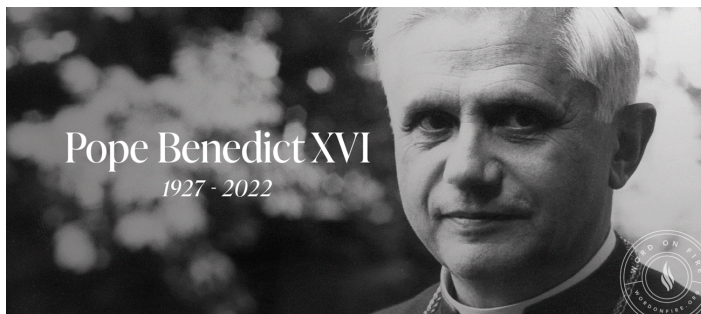

Our Fascinating Faith Calendars

Perhaps you noticed that this year we didn't celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday after Epiphany (today), but instead on last Monday, the day after Epiphany. Why the shift? It all has to do with regional calendars. Within certain general boundaries, every national conference of bishops is able to set its own liturgical calendar according to how it is felt to benefit the people in that region most. So, for example, the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated January 6 on the Church's universal calendar. But the bishops of the United States decided that, for the benefit of the faithful, it would be better for Epiphany to be celebrated on a Sunday every year. So here in the States we see Epiphany's date vary from January 2 to January 8. The biggest problem this presents is that the Baptism of the Lord, which is normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, would push back the whole liturgical calendar by a week on the years when the Sunday celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7 or 8, putting the U.S. out of sync with the rest of the Catholic world at least until Lent. To avoid that scenario, the U. S. bishops decreed that in those years the Baptism of the Lord would fall on the Monday after Epiphany, leaving the rest of the calendar intact.

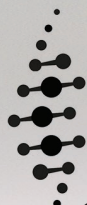

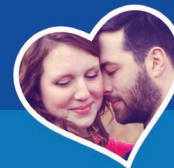

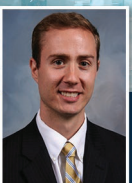
