"We speak God's wisdom, mysterious, hidden..." ~ 1 Corinthians 7

Marriage is one of the mysteries hidden in God. With all divine mysteries we can't fully comprehend the depth of the truth, beauty, and goodness of Marriage. But we can come to know the truth about it, even if dimmed this side of Heaven.

We recognize the beautiful design in our human nature that draws man and woman together in marriage for the good of themselves and for the creation of family. In all of the humanness of marriage, we see the beauty and the struggle it takes to bring two lives together as one. We know the joy and heartbreak of lived relationships that are not yet perfected in Christ. We experience the unity and discord that comes with living the ups and downs of daily life together. If couples are blessed with children, we recognize the daily challenges and victories that come with parenting. Let's be honest, broken human nature is tough to live with!

The hidden reality of Marriage is found in heart of God but fully revealed to us in Christ. Marriage which is good in it's natural state becomes supernatural through grace of Jesus Christ. What is natural, built into our human DNA, becomes a sacrament. St. Josephine Bakhita (February 8) was a captured slave from Africa, that was tortured and beaten much of her life by her masters, but came to a conversion to Christ amidst her suffering and shared the joy of Christ with others through her suffering.

Our Lady of Lourdes (February 11), is the story of Our Mother Mary, appearing to a poor, naive, young girl Bernadette in Lourdes, France, in the middle 1800's (1844-1879), to bring the believers and unbelievers back to her son Jesus. A miraculous healing spring appeared, and well as many other healing miracles have occurred there over time at this shrine. St. Bernadette's incorrupt body lies in state at a convent in Nevers, France.

What You Do Matters...

Something MUST be said about the laws being passed at the Minnesota Statehouse because they are over the top extremist (dare I use that overworked word these days??) in nature. It is perhaps the most grievous example of "what you do matters" in recent Minnesotan history. Elections have consequences and when we don't keep a balance between the parties, the pendulum swings far more than any of us could imagine. We are now faced with the passing of a bill that allows killing a baby in the womb the entire nine months of pregnancy for any reason whatever. It has been signed, sealed and delivered.

What else is coming, you ask, what else can they possibly do in this arena? Buckle in, there's more!

There is Senate File 70 which completely deregulates abortion in this state – repealing mandatory reporting of abortion complications, parental notification prior to performing an abortion on a minor, and a host of other common-sense laws. They will be moving it through the legislature as soon as possible, followed by... the elimination of public support for pregnancy centers. You know, those centers that assist pregnant and parenting women in carrying their pregnancies to term while developing healthy habits and stable families. In a recent Star Tribune article, Dr. Collette points out that it is the abortion industry trying to eliminate their competition. We have no concept of the amount of money pouring into the pockets of the abortion support system, from the business to the lobbyists, to the legislators, the research companies who buy the body parts of the babies for experiments to the pharmaceutical companies who benefit on one side with contraceptives and the other side with the abortion pill and all the while saying that abstinence and purity isn't possible.

Our Fascinating Faith

The Seven Holy Founders of the Servite Order (February 17)

On February 17, we honor the seven founding saints of the Order of the Servants of the Virgin Mary. Bonfilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene and Buonagiunta were a group of merchants of Florence who, upon experiencing an apparition of the Blessed Virgin in 1233, renounced their businesses, left what was necessary for their families, and distributed the rest among the poor. They then dedicated themselves entirely to the veneration of the Virgin Mary, going to live on an Italian mountain, each assuming the life of a hermit—prayer, extreme fasting and penance. Sometime later, at the request of the pope's delegate, all but one were ordained priests. Brother Alexis, considering himself unworthy of the priesthood, decided to remain as a brother. They were all canonized in 1888. Their feast day, originally February 11, now falls on the 17, the date of the death of the last of the seven founders. Brother Alexis at the age of 110.
