

From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain



"You have heard that it was said,
You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.
But I say to you, love your enemies
and pray for those who persecute you."

~ Matthew 5:43-44

Love our enemies? Really?! That's a ridiculously difficult request. Yet, Jesus Christ not only calls us forth to that in our Gospel this weekend, but we see Him model that request for us. He loves and forgives Judas, Peter, the Pharisees, the Sadducees, the soldiers who kill Him, and many others who hurt Him. Jesus loved His enemies with a truly sacrificial love. Don't get me wrong, He hated the sin, but He most certainly loved the sinners. As we approach Lent, I think it is important to look at our attitude toward those we disagree with, or have hurt us. We are called forth to love them, but what does that look like? It can start by praying for them. Pray, "Lord, be with (name). Help me to see their perspective but also see Your perspective, so that your peace and grace may bring about healing in our relationship. May we have respect and appreciation for each other, even if we continue to disagree. Help us both to have willingness to grow, so that your kingdom would be more fully established here on Earth. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen."

We see so much division in our world right now with the ongoing wars and conflicts. We see so much division in our nation at the most recent State of the Union Address. We see so much division in our state with the evil abortion laws that were passed recently that allow abortion right up to birth. We see even division in our city, as I am getting emails now from city workers who list their preferred pronouns. So, I believe, this Gospel comes at a perfect time as we approach Lent. I encourage you to utilize this Lent to grow in charity toward your enemies. Offer up your fasting for them and see what the Lord does with those sacrifices. The Sacrifice on the Cross brought about healing and the salvation of the world. Your Lenten Sacrifices will help further that healing in the world and bring about greater ability to love our enemies.



What You Do Matters... (Continued)

A bill has been introduced in the U.S> Senate that would prohibit the executive branch from expanding abortion access through a public health emergency. The idea has been floated by the White House. The bill would prevent any emergency declaration that was intended to promote, support, or expand access to abortion or punish states that have restricted abortion. It would expressly prohibit the president from declaring a national emergency or an emergency declaration under the Stafford Act and prohibit the Secretary of Health and Human Services from declaring a public health emergency for this purpose. A public health emergency declaration is normally issued to address severe weather, disease outbreaks, or other imminent health emergencies. Some think it is an end run around the Hyde Amendment which prohibits the federal government from funding abortion except in the exception of rape, incest, and a threat to the life of the mother.


If pro-abortion advocates are truly concerned about women facing difficult circumstances, they would support the pregnancy centers that serve them and outnumber Planned Parenthood 14 to 1 nationwide, but instead they seek to undermine, intimidate, and close these life supportive ministries.

So, if "What You Do Matters," what is your take away? KNOW who you vote for and what they stand for. Be heard! Let them know what you think now that they are in office. Let others know what is happening in the legislative process. Pray all along the way — before, during and after you vote. What you do matters.


