#### Written Report – Jen Livermont, Coordinator for Discipleship for Families

**Childcare** – In addition to our regular programs that we provide childcare for, we will also provide childcare for the First Communion Kickoff in February. In March we will be adding childcare for RCIA couples who are meeting with the priests before convalidation of their marriages.

**Sunday School** – We learned about St. Valentine and all the kids received a St. Valentine card and candy. We talked about Ash Wednesday early because we will be off on the Sunday of President's Weekend. The kids learned that the palm branches from Palm Sunday are burned to make the ashes for Ash Wednesday. Everyone was able to touch the ash to see that it is not hot and they were able to draw a cross on their forehead or hand. There is always some apprehension and fear at Ash Wednesday, so it helps when we can demystify the ashes. Everyone will receive a Lenten book on the first Sunday of Lent.

**Catholic Kids Bulletins –** We have been printing 100 Catholic Kids Bulletins every weekend. This is a good amount most weeks. We will cut back starting with Memorial Weekend.

**Family Formation** – Family Formation went well in February. We had a smaller group this month. Fr. Joseph spoke about the Holy Spirit with the parents. Deb Marsh, our third grade catechist, came up with a fun idea for teaching about the Holy Spirit based upon one of the ideas in the curriculum. We lit a three wick candle in the classroom and talked about how the three wicks represent the three persons of the Holy Trinity all within the one body of the candle. After the scented candle was lit for a few minutes the scent (which the kids could not see) filled the room, just as the Holy Spirit does not usually have a physical presence but can be experienced in different ways. This was a great, concrete concept that even the preschoolers understood and were excited about. The Holy Spirit can be with us and all around us even if we can't see Him!

Fr. Paul will be speaking in March to the parents and we will have 8 priests here to do confession for the eligible students and parents. What a fantastic opportunity in Lent! This has been incredibly fruitful for the students and parents in the past few years. Many people who don't normally go to confession went to confession last year.

**First Communion Kick-off** – I assisted Jill with the student portion of the First Communion Kickoff event. I facilitated the church scavenger hunt and First Communion bingo with Fr. Paul. The kids loved both activities! They worked very diligently to find all the elements of the church and Mass for the scavenger hunt. They really enjoyed being able to investigate the sanctuary space up close!

**Vacation Bible School** – Registration will open the first weekend of March on the website. VBS is June 20-22 from 9-noon.

**Totus Tuus** - Registration will open the first weekend of March on the website. Totus Tuus is July 24-28 for the grade school program.

#### Written Report – Jessica Balzarini, Director of Parish Life

**Cana Marriage Ministry:** St. John's is continuing to expand our Marriage Enrichment offerings to build strong, healthy, and holy marriages. Cana Dinner has been an anchor event for over 20 years, This event offers an elegant evening at St. John's celebrating marriage. It offers the couple a catered dinner, marriage blessing, and a beautiful message about the beauty and goodness of marriage. It is a place for growth. 30 couples will be in attendance with a large crew to help execute the event.

We will also be offering a new series called Cana Marriage Minute. An opportunity for couples to work together to better their marriage. March we will offer a 2-part series that will give couples tools to improve communication and effectively navigate through conflict, remaining united verses divided. This month will be led by parishioner, Bradley Barker a licensed professional clinical counselor who is passionate about the emotional and spiritual health of the modern family and desires to help each individual move from surviving to thriving.

**Men's Retreat** *Awaken*: Retreat will be March 3-5. The retreat offers time for getting to know other men in the parish through great talks and small group times. Learn new forms of prayer and take advantage of Confession, Adoration and Mass. There are 9 spots still open.

Baptism: Class on February 13 with 6 couples.

**First Sacraments:** The First Reconciliation Retreat was Sunday, January 22 with an altering start of 2:00pm or 2:45pm. Parent/child worked through some review materials and tour of the confessional as well as large group time with Jill Fink and Fr. Paul. First Reconciliation Celebration was Saturday, January 28 at 9am in the church with several priests available to hear confessions for the children and families. Several children had the stomach flu, so several made their first reconciliation the following Wednesday and a few to still reschedule. Parents and children kicked off their First Eucharist preparation on Saturday, February 11 at 1pm with a time of prayer/adoration, parent orientation on First Communion Home Lessons and announcements while the children enjoyed a liturgical scavenger hunt and first communion bingo with Fr. Paul.

**RCIC:** Families will met on February 5 for their Monthly Family Meeting wrapping up the pillars of faith from their Faith Fusion book. February 26 starts the preparation for their First Eucharist. The students continue to meet with their age groups as well.

**Becoming Catholic RCIA:** Candidates who feel ready to come into the church this Easter Vigil will celebrate the Rite of Sending and Rite of Election on Sunday, February 26 at the 10:30am Mass and then travel to the Cathedral later in the afternoon. Candidates will enter the period of Lent: purification and enlightenment where we'll break open the Gospels and celebrate the Penitential Rite for the baptized making their first reconciliation on March 5 at the 8:30am Mass followed by Scrutinies for our Elect the following three Sundays, rotating through the Mass schedules.

**Formation Parent Program**: February Formation Night was February 1 with Fr. Joseph presenting on The Holy Spirit: Power and Strength for the Family. Families gathered together for a time of prayer led by Sarah Wilder to invite the Holy Spirit into the space of their lives to bring His power and strength. March Family Formation Night is March 1. The topic is The Church and Our Journey to Heaven with Fr. Paul presenting and the opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

**Marriage Ministry**: Our four couples in RCIA piloting the Witness to Love Convalidation curriculum will have a joint Marriage Blessing on Sunday, March 26 after the 10:30am Mass. We've had an influx of engaged couples and all priests and deacons, including Deacon Tom and wife Judy, are joining in the preparation for them.

# **RCIC Rite of Christian Initiation of Children**

Families with students in grades 3-8 who desire the sacraments of Baptism/First Reconciliation and First Eucharist (Holy Communion) enter the wonderful process/journey called Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC). The church instructs that a child at this age can make a response of faith, with proper catechesis and formation, and so, the church prepares them with their parent's partnership for the initiating sacraments according to their age. If children are age 15 or older, we prepare within the Confirmation program but with all sacramental preparation and celebration.

Preparation is threefold:

Enrolled in our age-appropriate programs in either St. John the Baptist Catholic School or St. John's Family Formation (grade 2-5) or Middle School Faith Formation (grades 6-8) or Confirmation (grades 9-12) programs.

Attend a monthly **Family Sunday Meeting** once a month on Sunday morning at 9:30-10:15am in room 211 with Jill Fink, Director of Catechesis. These sessions are to check in with the families and insert other catholic teachings such as liturgical calendar and sacramental preparation of all the sacraments. Families are invited to sit together at Mass either before the class at the 8:30am Mass or at the 10:30am Mass to build community.

Children attend **Sacramental Class** within the School or Formation program system. Children in grades 3-5 attend the Sacrament Class during Family Formation sessions. Youth in MS FF program will meet 3 sessions for Reconciliation and 3 sessions for Eucharist with Sarah Wilder, MS Youth Minister. Children at St. John's School will attend 3 sessions for Reconciliation and 3 sessions for Eucharist with Ms. Fink after school. See additional schedules.

#### **Optional:**

Accompaniment of Catholic Faith Overview. Find a family to work with you through the 20 lessons in the Faith Fusion curriculum that give an overview of the Catholic Faith. This family should be someone you know who attends St. John's each Sunday for Mass.
