- Called Forth in Lent. Ash Wednesday is February 22 and we are hopeful this Lenten season will give many people the opportunity to take the next step on our Journey of Faith. Once again this year we are adding Friday evening Masses at 5:30 pm. We are also adding Saturday morning Masses at 9:30 am; please note the different time. This is to accommodate the Men's small groups and the Synod Evangelization Team training that are both happening on Saturday mornings.
- Men's Small Groups. This Lent Fr. Joseph and I will be hosting about 30 men on Monday nights and another 30 men on Saturday mornings for fellowship and small groups. We will gather for a half hour of socializing at the rectory and then break into four small groups and reflect upon the upcoming Sunday scripture readings. We focused on inviting young married men from SJB into these small groups as a way of strengthening our community and fostering them as leaders in the faith for their families. Please pray for all the men involved.
- Capital Campaign. As we continue to discuss and refine the Church Interior project, we are preparing to launch a capital campaign to cover the cost and help us sustain the growth in our programs. We will be interviewing three firms that we are considering partnering with to help us reach our goals. We are still discerning the total amount and the exact items that we will fundraising for, but the majority is the various capital improvements that we need to complete to maintain our campus and sustain the vital ministries that are happening here at SJB.

For this year's event on February 18 thirty couples were registered and there was a large crew to help serve the event.

• Summer Planning. The discipleship staff is busy sustaining their ministries but also looking forward to summer ministry offerings. - 2023/24 Budget Planning Process. At this month's Finance Commission meeting the budget planning process begins in earnest with the commission being presented a preliminary budget. The budget will be reviewed and revised based on Finance Commission input and other information over the next two months, such as our actual revenue and expense as we move closer to the end of the current fiscal year.
- Chapel of the Angels Renovation. We are now about a week into this project! Our general contractor Steve Arndorfer is working in the chapel, implementing the first steps involved in reorienting the room and preparing for the installation of new features. For safety, please note that the chapel is closed until further notice.
- Church Interior & School Improvements. We are in the process of refining the project scope of our improvements in both the church and the school. Much more communication will follow once these decisions are made, but right now we are focusing on some masonry work on the church roof, resetting the windows over the baptismal font (due to frequent leaking), stripping and painting the church ceiling, upgrading the church's original mechanical systems, adding a new sound system and renovating our school's restrooms. Our parish leaders have been actively discerning priorities among the many things we can do to improve our campus, to continue to be good stewards of our physical plant and the many gifts of our parishioners. Please pray for success in this process!
- Catholic Services Appeal. The kick-off for this year's Catholic Services Appeal (CSA) is this coming weekend, February 25/26. St. John's goal for 2023 is \$113,996. Our parish also benefits from this Appeal because when we meet our goal, as we have consistently done for many years, we earn a parish rebate check. The more we raise, the more we benefit. The formula for the rebate has two parts: 50% above our goal is returned to the parish and 25% above the prior year's results is returned to the parish. Last year we raised over \$172,055 and our goal was \$109,052, so we were \$63,003 over goal. Our first rebate check totaled \$22,674, and we should receive another smaller amount later this spring for donations received by the CSA at year-end. Please be generous to the Appeal this year, as you always have been! Thank you.
