Finance Commission – Marian B.

- We are handling hospitality the weekend of April 22 23
- Reviewed financials: Still below budget on Sunday giving but are profitable overall and above budget. Passed a motion to give the option of covering credit card fees to electronic givers and other things that are charged – would be 3%.
- Received '22-'23 budget: It is not yet balanced and we discussed ways to improve it. Will be approved at our April meeting.
- Approved a motion to use capital reserves to fund part of the youth room renovations: carpeting and paint. We have a grant for \$15,000 and we approved \$10,000 above that.
- Discussed current banking situation and determined we will purchase insurance to protect our bank deposits above the \$250,000 government guaranteed insurance.
- Approved capital campaign feasibility study by Steier Group.
