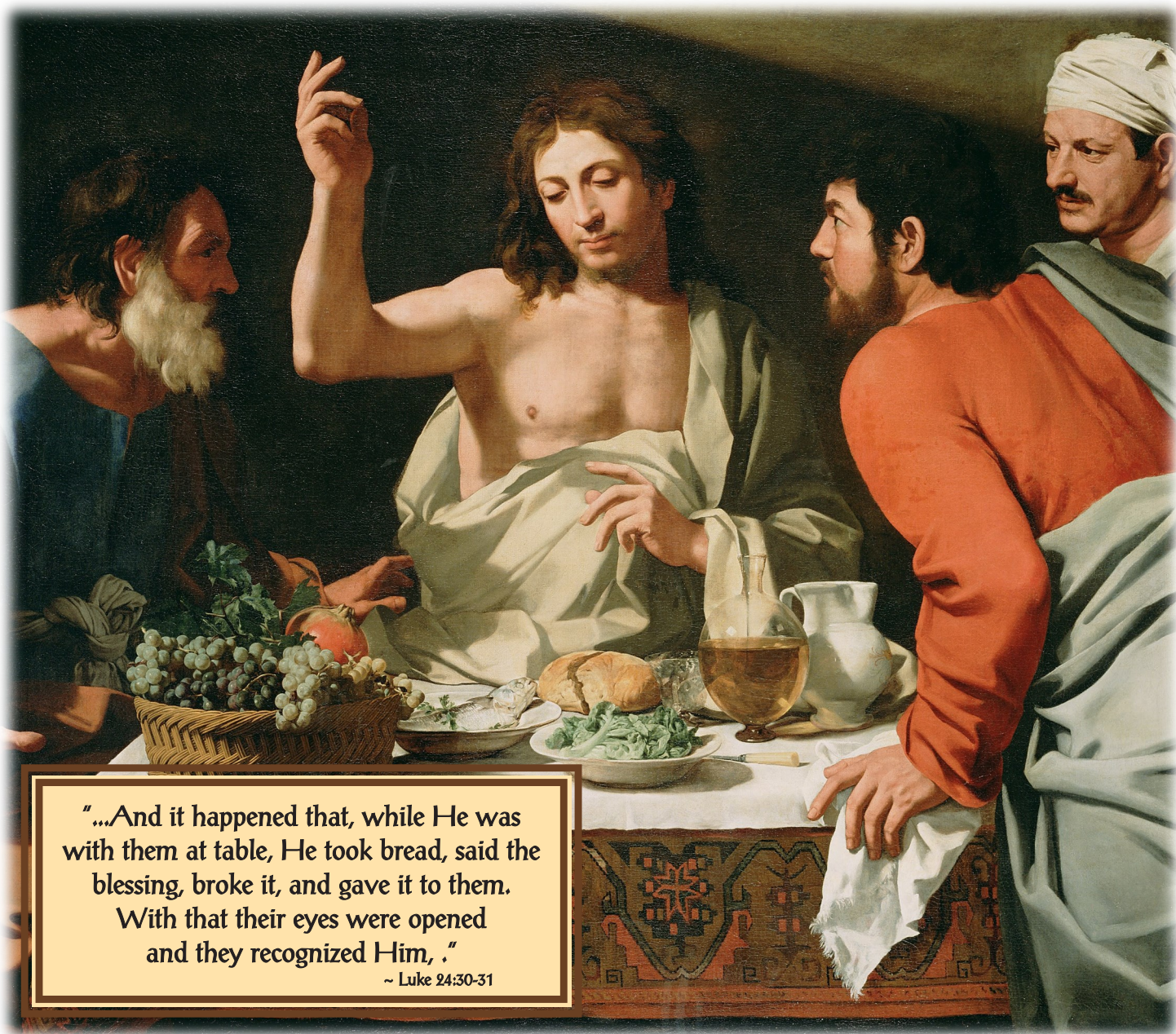

## *From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain*

### **Called Forth to Grow in Community!**

Our Lent 2023 Small Group Season bore much fruit this year. With over 15 small groups meeting throughout each week of Lent and about 250 parishioners involved in small groups, the Lord was working in the hearts and lives of parishioners here at SJB!

This past Lent, Fr. Joseph and I hosted about 25 men from SJB on Monday evenings and another 25 Saturday mornings for food, fellowship, and faith sharing. We would start with a half hour social time in Pier 153 (the tiki bar Fr. Magner built in our rectory basement.) It was a great way to connect men with other men from the parish. Then we broke into 4 small groups throughout the rectory for faith sharing and reflecting on the upcoming Sunday scripture readings. It was inspiring to me to see these men connecting on a deeper level and realizing that they are not alone in trying to go against the tide of our society by living as men of faith. The men found other brothers in Christ who could support them through the challenges and rejoice with them in their victories. I was really excited that a couple of the guys from my group got together outside of our meetings for time together with their children. It was also encouraging to see them visiting in St. Joseph Hall after Mass now, since they know each other's names.

One of the fruits that I have seen as well is that two of the men approached me about getting each of their marriages blessed in the Catholic Church. Another one of the men in the group shared that he was only Baptized Catholic and desires to receive the Sacrament of Confession as well as the other Sacraments of Initiation. The Holy Spirit is moving in the midst of small groups at SJB and it is exciting to see.

Archbishop Hebda has asked pastors to prioritize small group ministry in the next year and we intend to do just that. If you are interested in becoming a small group leader, please contact Jessica Balzarini at the parish office. We were at capacity in our small groups for the number of trained leaders we have, and we need more. Please pray about whether the Lord is calling you forth into mission. I am meeting with our Synod Evangelization team on April 29 to plan a vision for the coming year of how we can grow our small group ministry.

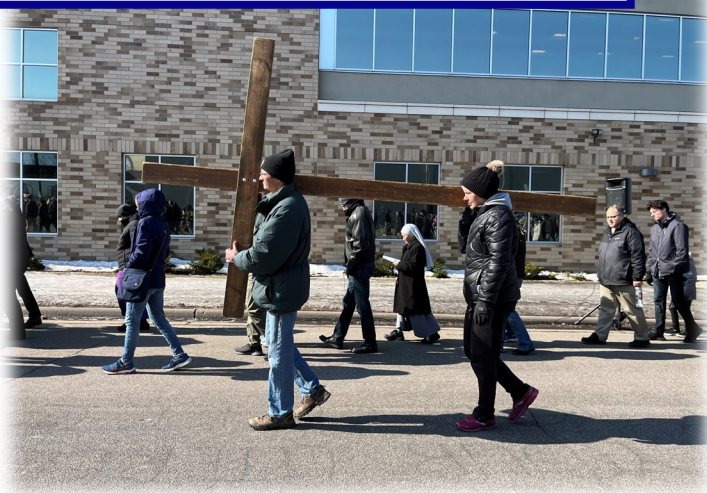






### Good Friday Prayer Vigil

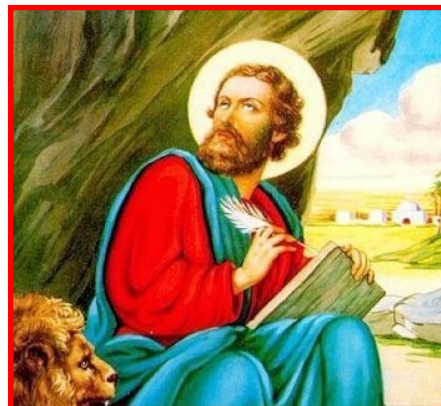
## Our Fascinating Faith Neophytes

Perhaps you've noticed that those who were baptized and newly initiated into the Church at Easter are still sitting in a prominent location during Sunday Mass. Aren't they done? What's going on?

During this Easter season the newly initiated are called "neophytes," and they are living through the final period of the catechumenal process, known by the name "mystagogy." They are exploring the mysteries of their new identity, reflecting on the meaning of the sacraments they celebrated at the Easter Vigil, and strengthening their bonds with Christ and the Christian community. That they are living their new identity in such a public way should be an inspiration to the rest of us, a sign that this new life in Christ really makes a difference. And they are also still in need of the prayers and support of the rest of the community.

As neophytes and fully-initiated members of the Christian community, they are no longer being dismissed for catechesis during Mass. Perhaps you might take advantage of their presence at the end of Mass and engage one in conversation. Learn about their experience and let them know of your continuing prayers and support for them.

# Called Forth into Mission

an update from Camryn Sulak, former SJB NET Missionary  
and current FOCUS Missionary

Hello my dear friends and family! You are a gift! I've said it before, but I'm so grateful for your support and the ability it has given me to live out this mission. There were so many graces from The Lord this past month on mission, and I'm excited to share some with you!

One of my joys this past month was serving on a FOCUS mission trip during spring break with The Sisters of Life in New York City! Two students from Tulsa, Abby and Carmen, joined me in this opportunity to generously serve The Lord during their school break. We were joined by two other FOCUS Missionaries from UT Austin along with students from UT Austin, Vanderbilt, LSU and Franciscan. The week included a retreat, serving alongside the Sisters and living their everyday life in their crisis pregnancy missions, a formation day, evangelical outreach in New York City, fellowship, and a weekend of leisure with the Sisters to finish the trip. The Sister's mission is to protect and enhance the sanctity of human life. Throughout the trip we were reminded and convicted of our own goodness and the gift we are, and how that is true for everyone we encounter!

This past month, my team and I have also invited students into authentic friendship with the hope of leading them to an encounter with Jesus Christ through:

- Investing in students through our spring break mission trip, Bible studies, movie nights, sharing meals, coffee shop talks, walks and more!
- Inviting women into deeper community and friendships by hosting bi-weekly women's group - we discussed our femininity, receptivity, and modesty.
- Hosting Upper Room, an event where students in discipleship gather together to dive deeper into what it means to live as a disciple of Christ - this month we discussed how God desires to heal our wounds through the sacraments
