Called Forth to Live like the Lord!

In our first reading at Mass this weekend, we see that establishing the kingdom of God is a team effort as the deacons are called forth to assist the apostles in their ministry. In the Gospel, Jesus calls His apostles forth to follow Him, who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. We, too, are called forth on the Way as we navigate the ups and downs of our lives. What does the Way look like? Well, look to Christ and look at the Saints. Christ is the Way, as He leads us back to the Father. The Saints follow the Way to get to Heaven. Thus, we are invited to reflect upon the response of the Saints in order to see more clearly the Way to Heaven.

It is a team effort to get to Heaven, as we need to support each other on the Way. It was important for Christ to have His team of 12 and it is important for us to have people around us to support our growth in holiness. As Catholics, we live differently. We live with selflessness as we follow Christ's Way, rather than doing it our way. His Way is the path that leads to life in abundance. Think about today how the Lord desires you to be called forth along the Way and how He invites you to call others forth along the way as well!
