From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain



Looking Back and Forward, grounded on the Eucharist

As we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of our Lord, we stand firmly rooted in the Eucharist. Through this tremendous gift, we are united to God and to one another. It helps us to love like Jesus himself. It gives us confidence as the Father established us as His children and nourishes us with the Eucharist to live in Communion with Him. It is from this place of confidence that we reflect back on the past year and look forward in hope!

This past year we were "Called Forth" to take the next step on the journey of faith. Those steps included many parents bringing their infants or children for Baptism. Those steps included many people being called home to Heaven. Even in the midst of the sorrow of the many funerals we celebrated this past year, we live in hope knowing that we are made for eternal life in Heaven. Many people were called forth through our programs as we saw a rise in attendance at many of our events from the All Saints Party to the Journey to the Inn to the Easter Egg Hunt. We were called by Archbishop Hebda to put together a Synod Evangelization Team and 20 staff and parishioners stepped up to form that team. We saw growth in our school and anticipate even more growth next year. Our family formation program was also the largest it has been in several years. Many, many people have taken the next step in the journey of faith and it is inspiring to see.

Looking forward, Archbishop Hebda is calling us to prioritize Small Group ministry. While we are fortunate to have a strong presence of small group ministry at SJB, we want to strengthen it for years to come. I believe small groups are a vital place of conversion and support. As we discern how to strengthen them and follow Archbishop's vision, our new theme will have a small group component. His pastoral letter was titled "You will be my Witnesses!" In light of that theme and the focus of small groups, our theme for the program year of 2023-2024 will be "Gather to Witness." We will look for way to support everyone who comes through our doors in sharing their faith. It is hard to talk about our faith nowadays as we do not want to offend people. However, we are called to share our faith with others and we will discuss and develop ways that we can do that to further Christ's kingdom here in New Brighton and beyond.

Our themes have been the following: 2019-2020 "Inviting In", 2020-2021 "United in the Holy Spirit", 2021-2022 "Restored to Life", 2022-2023 "Called Forth".

These themes have given us a focus and a point of connection throughout the year. In the Weekend Experience Survey regarding homilies, I heard from people that they want depth and things to not be repeated. I appreciate the feedback and I do want to provide depth to help you grow deeper in your faith. I also want to respect your time and avoid unnecessary repetition. While the themes are not necessarily deep, my hope is that throughout the year, we develop and cultivate a depth around it in order to help you understand the Lord's invitation personally for your life. With regards to the repetition and sharing the same theme throughout the year, fundamentals are key to success in whatever you do. Understanding the fundamentals of the faith and living them out will help co-naturalize our will with the Lord.



So how do we do that? Well, if you give to the Respect Life Group here in the parish, you are supporting many efforts to help and walk with mothers: The Kidz Closet provides clothes, diapers, wet wipes, shoes, etc. for babies and children. Families make an appointment to come to get what they need and our volunteers are ready to serve and show their support. They also stock the bathroom changing tables and the nursing moms' space in church.

The Respect Life Group does fundraisers and events all year in an effort to educate us and to support Pro-Life organizations with direct hands-on approaches to helping parents. In a year, we, as a parish, support Abria and the Women's Life Care Center in Little Canada, among several other prolife organizations each doing the work in their own niche. Both women's centers serve young moms and dads with the basics, as well as walking alongside them during and after the pregnancy, offer life coaching and parenting classes. Relationships are established and communities of support and encouragement bloom. Their glory stories are well anchored in Jesus and respect for every person whom they come across, born and pre-born. This is where our Baby Tree gifts go as well. These are the places we would recommend to anyone who is pregnant and unsure what to do next. They can find information, hope and help at any pro-life women's care center. these are the ones we know well.

With the anniversary of the overturning of Roe v. Wade on June 24. 2022, on the Feast of the Sacred Heart, some pro-lifers have declared June to be "Pro-Life Month"! It is a wonderful opportunity to celebrate all that the Lord is and has done for us! The overturning of Roe v Wade was the answer to almost 50 years of prayer! On the heels of that remarkable event came the Asbury Revival – an organic prayer revival that started as a regular prayer meeting on a KY college campus and was spiritually lit on fire! That prayer meeting lasted for a continual 2-week period with thousands of people coming to join in. It was amazing to watch and join online! Kidz Closet

Many in our community struggle to provide diapers, clothing, and other essentials for their growing families. Parishioners of St. John's have always exceeded in generosity to supply those needs. For the past fourteen years we have welcomed women in need to our Kidz Closet (formerly known as the Maternity/Baby Closet). Your donations of new or gently used, CLEAN clothing has provided much-needed help. Clients are allowed to visit once a month and select items from our current inventory.

The Day God gave us not one Miracle but two!

The First Miracle

Larry went to the YMCA on May 9 as was his usually routine. He finished his exercise workout, had gone to the locker room and was removing his gym clothes when he felt faint and blacked out . There was one other man in the men's locker room and as it turned out he was a doctors assistant. He notified the front desk, they called their first responders and called 911 . Larry became alert to find someone taking his vital signs. Within minutes the ambulance arrived and transported him to North Memorial Hospital. The ambulance notified the hospital that they were transporting a heart attack victim. When the ambulance arrived at the hospital they were ready for Larry and took him directly up to surgery. They found he had a completely blocked artery feeding the right heart lobe. Two others were 30% functional. They immediately operated on him putting in a stent. They decided that they could improve the blood flow in the other two arteries with medication. They got him stabilized and the next day they put in a pacemaker. His own pacemaker was working fine, but due to Larry's age (87) and the medication they were going to give him they decided to put in an artificial pacemaker too. Because he was in good shape from going to the Y three times a week for many years his recovery was fast. He left the hospital in 4 days.

It was because of the grace of God that there was someone else in the locker room at that time. Often at that time of day when it was not busy there can be only you in the locker room. The YMCA had first responders on their staff. The ambulance service was close by and responded so quickly. The hospital was ready for him. When you have a heart attack minutes are vital.

God Comes to my Aid

The ambulance staff called me and I was to meet them at the emergency entrance of the hospital. I was not familiar with the hospital and went in the wrong parking ramp, ended up in the wrong building. When I tried to find the emergency wing there were only 2 people there waiting for an elevator and neither one knew. As if God had sent him, the Chaplin for the hospital appeared and asked if he could help me. He called three places to try to locate where they had taken Larry. No one seemed to know. As it turned out when Larry had arrived at the hospital he was not admitted but had been taken directly up to the emergency surgery unit. The Chaplin had to contact several places before he found this information. He took me up to that floor and stayed with me until the nurses had located where Larry was. I don't know how I would have found my husband without him. They admitted Larry the next day so when I was looking for him they had no record of him being in the hospital. When something like this happens the loved ones are under a great deal of stress and are not functioning at their best. So God was with me too.
