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Written Report – Jen Livermont, Coordinator for Discipleship for Families

Childcare – We provided childcare for the First Communion Retreat and the three practices for First Communion. We also provided childcare for the Reach More Small Group Celebration. We finished childcare for Circle of Women for the year. They typically have a session once during the summer, but we have not received dates yet for that. The Reach More Small Group that meets on Wednesday mornings will be finished.

Sunday School – We finished up our last weeks of Sunday School with the readings of Jesus after His resurrection. On our last day we read about the Ascension and Pentecost. The students made headbands with the flame of the Holy Spirit on them. Fr. Paul visited the 10:30am class and took a picture with the students. The students got a book with all the coloring pages and Bible stories that we read over the year so they can go back and read stories and finish coloring the pictures. Students also received a little end of the year goody bag including a prayer bear.

Catholic Kids Bulletins – I will be putting 120 Catholic Kids Bulletins out each weekend in May and then I will reevaluate to see once summer gets into full swing if that is too many.

Family Formation – The May Family Formation had a good the best turnout we have probably ever had in May! Instead of a speaker we had testimonies from participants. It is always a challenge with the warm weather and the beginning of lots of summer sports. We began the evening with a nacho bar for dinner. Kids had a shortened class time then gathered with their prayer partners to play Easter Bingo. The kids were able to choose from saint magnets or saint blocks as prizes. We also had WOG log raffle using all the WOG logs turned in for the whole year. We gave out 10 Dairy Queen \$5 gift cards. At the end of the night, we had Dilly Bars for an end of the year treat! Parents took students into the church for a short teaching on Miraculous Medal. The students received a blessed Miraculous Medal and prayed some Marian prayers. They all went downstairs to the Youth Room to see the Middle Schoolers present on the Old Testament Bible timeline. It was a very fun end of year and many families stayed late to socialize.

Vacation Bible School – VBS is June 20-22 from 9-noon. We have a waiting list with about 15 kids on it so far. I am waiting to see if Preschool will be bringing one or two classrooms of students to VBS before we decide if we will open more spots. We will be using the 2 preschool classrooms in the basement. The class of preschoolers attending the summer program will stay in their classroom. I am looking into using the second preschool room for our 4th classroom. Preschool has that currently reserved for a second summer classroom.

Totus Tuus - Totus Tuus is July 24-28 for the grade school program. We have 81 students signed up and we are closed for the day program.

First Communion – I assisted Jill with the First Communion retreat as well as the First Communion Masses.

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Night of Gratitude – was a great evening with a lot of powerful testimonies.

Anniversary Celebration – of the dedication of the church will be Thursday, June 22nd. This will be a great event to invite all the VBS participants to since we will have our last day and water event that afternoon. We will have a daily Mass at 5:30pm, dinner, ice cream treats and a DJ out in the parking lot.

Written Report – Jessica Balzarini, Director of Parish Life

Reach More Mission Training: There will be summer Reach More Mission Training offered on Thursday evenings beginning in June. It is a 12-week training for those who are ready to take the next step in their relationship with Jesus and have a desire to help others have a relationship with Jesus and the Church. Each session wrestles with the Church's call to evangelize and the essential part of every Christian's lived faith life. Each session consists of growing in personal prayer, being equipped with practical skills necessary to invite others and share faith, as well as sound church teaching on what Catholic evangelization is and isn't. All who have participated have experienced personal growth.

Synod Implementation: Our Synod Evangelization Team (SET) has its first Visioning Day at the end of April. It was a good day filled with direction and formation from Archbishop Hebda and Bishop Williams. The team put together a plan for our Implementation of the Archbishops 1st Year Priority – Beginning Small Groups. We found in our discussion that St. John's is ahead of the game when it comes to small groups, but the Holy Spirit was leading us in ways to plan to expand this essential method of growing in our relationship with Jesus and each other. We have seen first-hand its effectiveness. Small Groups will become the backbone of the way we evangelize and catechize here at St. John's. SET members will be making invitations to parishioners to go through the fall training throughout the summer. Begin to seek the Holy Spirit if you are called to do the training!

Cana Marriage Ministry: Cana Marriage Ministry has completed 2 Marriage Minute sessions aiding couples in handling conflict and staying united as a couple. The plan is to offer monthly sessions on differing topics again next ministry year.

When couples were surveyed on needs, they have, social gatherings to meet more people at St. John's was very high on the list. We will be offering a Bunco night for married couples with childcare provided on June 10th.

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Night of Gratitude: The Office of Discipleship and Mission staff partnered with Mary May, Development Associate for the Night of Gratitude. The evening was spent saying thank you all those who work alongside our staff to provide our amazing programming and events to help St. John's live its mission to Bear Witness to Jesus Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. Go. Make. Teach. We also asked some donors to attend as well so they could hear the powerful testimonies of four of our parishioners. They spoke about what God is doing in the hearts and lives because of the work the opportunities we provide at SJB.

Safe Environment. As we continue to create safe and healthy environments here at St. John's we begin our parish audit season. For those who work children, youth, and vulnerable adults there is a rigorous process of checks and training to volunteer in the education, formation, and pastoral care of the groups. Each year the Archdiocese does an audit of our work to be sure every parish follows national and local requirements.

Baptism: Working with four families to have their older child baptized. Letter to grade 1 students in the parish explaining First Sacraments program and any baptism needs to connect this summer.

First Sacraments: First Communion celebrations on Saturday, May 6 at 4:30pm, Sunday, May 7 at 8:30am and 10:30am for 50 students. Three children celebrated on the alternative date of Sunday, May 14 at the 8:30am Mass. Registration is open for next year at the early rate. Letter sent to grade 1 students in the school. Parents informed at Family Formation of the program and registration open.

RCIC: Families interested in next year's sacramental needs should contact Jill.

Becoming Catholic RCIA: Mystogogy classes will run until Pentecost. Several people attended the RCIA Information Meeting on Sunday, April 30 at 9:30am in St. Joseph Hall.

Formation Parent Program: Our final Formation Night was Wed., May 3. The topic of Family Faith is Forever had parents reflecting on how God worked in their lives and called them forth in faith. Parents had an exercise to share, and three parents gave testimony. In addition to the final class, there will be a social and tour of youth room where the middle school students will present their salvation timeline periods. Registration is out for next year.

Marriage Ministry: All our mentor couples are engaged couples. Several couples are preparing for convalidation. A new program of Beloved is being piloted.

Adult Ministry: Plans are being made for a summer series on The Chosen.
