

#### From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain



Every two years, the priests of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis gather for a threeday assembly for fellowship and professional development. A few weeks ago, Fr. Joseph and I attended the gathering with about 220 priests and 6 bishops, 3 from our diocese, and 3 that were giving presentations. It was a wonderful opportunity for me to learn from my brother priests and gain wisdom from their many years of experience. I also appreciated the oppor-

tunity to learn from Bishop Barron from Winona-Rochester Diocese, Bishop Zielinski from New Ulm Diocese, and Bishop Felton from Duluth Diocese. Those men gave excellent reflections that greatly benefited my brother priests and I.

Bishop Barron spoke about 4 different figures from the Old Testament that we could study to gain appreciation and understanding of the priesthood. The four were Adam, Noah, Joshua, and Jacob. One reflection that I found quite insightful was Bishop Barron's comments about Noah needing to look forward and build the ark to prepare for the future. We need to look forward and strengthen our relationship with the ark of the Church to guide us through the future as we know there are storms upon us as we look at our culture and society. We do that through prayer, daily celebration of Mass, and building relationships with the faithful and fellow clergy. Bishop Zielinski spoke about Missionary Discipleship and shared stories about his time in military service. He spoke about the challenges of ministry and despite being in difficult situations, he was encouraged by his fellow servicemen and women to, "Press on Padre." We need to press on and stay the course as the mission of Evangelization is of the utmost importance to bring about the salvation of the world. Bishop Felton spoke about the importance of the Holy Spirit in the work of Evangelization. He shared different observations and shared how he sees the Holy Spirit truly at work in our world, especially here in our Archdiocese through the synod. I am grateful as well as I notice the Holy Spirit bringing about unity during the conference and I look forward to seeing what the Holy Spirit will do through our docility.

The assembly was an opportunity for me to live out our core value of being willing to grow as the Lord desires to strengthen us for the mission that he has called us to. This summer, take some time to study our faith whether it is utilizing our Library, attending one of the sessions of the Chosen Summer Study, or our other summer programming. Through this growth, the Lord will fortify you with His grace and Truth and help you become a saint.

# **Planning Study Update**

Just as Noah needed to build an ark to prepare for the future, we also need to prepare for the future at SJB! As you may know, we need to update and improve our facilities at the church and school so we can continue our mission to GO. MAKE. TEACH.

We are currently gathering feedback on projects that are considered high priority – church HVAC system, ceiling, sound system, and windows. School projects include bathroom repair, carpet replacement, and a playground surface upgrade. We have several secondary projects in mind as well. 



Some polls indicate that the public is receptive to assisted suicide. But the same polls show that people's views shift when they learn about its dangers—especially the dangers for those who are poor, elderly, disabled, or without access to good medical care. Consider that, in Oregon and California, some patients' health insurance offered to pay for assisted suicide, but not treatment. And in states where assisted suicide is legal, often no psychiatric evaluation or treatment is required. Additionally, assisted suicide fos-

ters discrimination by creating two classes of people: Assisted suicide fosters those whose suicides we spend millions of dollars to

#### SJB Year in Review Highlights for 2022-2023 "Called Forth"

#### **Generous Spirit:**

- t 400 people joined us for Journey to the Inn.
- t 375 parishioners turned in Core Commitment Campaign Pledges.
- t 202 people volunteered their time and talents at the Compassion Connect Clinic.
- t 300 Epiphany Blessing Bags were given out, as well as 240 Holy Water bottles.
- t Served 223 guests at the 2023 Compassion Connect Clinic.
- t \$2,600 was raised for formation programs through the Butter Braid Fundraiser.
- t \$28,294 was raised for Youth Programs through the Youth 365 Fundraiser.
- t 92 new families were welcomed to St. John the Baptist Church.
- t 181 volunteers and mission partners were honored at the Office of Discipleship and Mission "Night of Gratitude."
- t \$120,000 was raised at the Wines to Wishes event, the highest profit ever in the 18-year history of the event.
- + The April St. Vincent de Paul food drive received 311 bags of donated groceries weighing 3,894 lbs. and \$1,612 in cash donations.
- t The parish received over \$20,000 in wish-list contributions.
- + FallFest was the 3rd highest net revenue in the history of FallFest.
- + Assisted multiple families with tuition assistance.
- t Renovated the Chapel of the Angels to better serve our ministries and parishioners.
- + Hosted 2 Christmas Programs, one for Pre-K 2nd grade and another for 3rd grade– 8th grade.
- t Installed an adult changing table in the bathroom next to the library to support a culture of life.
- + Hosted the parents of kindergarten families for "meet and greets" at the rectory in August.
- + Updated the St. Therese room with a beautiful rose mural behind her statue and installed two stained glass windows.
- t Installed the boardwalk along the Stations in the courtyard of the church.
- t Funeral luncheon ministry continues to serve the grieving.
- t Thank you notes were sent to ministry coordinators to show recognition for their work at SJB.
- t The Parent and Teacher Organization hosted the Teacher and Staff Appreciation week in May.
- t 50 Year Club members gathered this June for the annual luncheon to honor their dedication to our parish.
- The Baby Gift Tree collected hundreds of diapers and baby supplies to donate to local Life Care Centers to help families in need.
- t Renovated the 2nd floor and lower floor bathroom countertops.
- + Working with JT Edgar Construction to begin renovating the church interior and school projects.
