


From the Pastor: Father Paul Shovelain - Planning Study Results

I would like to extend a special thanks to those who participated in the recent planning study conducted throughout our entire parish community. We received a strong response from both church and school families, feedback that is extremely beneficial as we plan for the future of St. John the Baptist.

After gathering and analyzing study data, Steier Group representatives reported their findings to members of church and school leadership on August 3, 2023. Below is a summary of their report and a list of next steps as we move forward.



PRIORITY OF RESPONDENTS





*A score above 6.5 is considered a "high priority". A score between 5 - 6.49 is considered a moderate priority.



PARTICIPATION AND FEEDBACK

- Conducted 80 Personal Interviews
- Received 506 Mail, Online and In-Pew Surveys
- 88% of all participants said they were in favor of a capital campaign



RECOMMENDATIONS

- Continue working with leadership on the Administrative Services Commission and the consulting team at JT Egner Construction to finalize plans for each prioritized project.
- Recruit a strong, diverse volunteer team to work on the campaign.
- Implement a transparent communications plan to address questions and concerns raised during the study.

NEXT STEPS

- Based on the positive results of the study, I am excited to announce that we will move forward with a capital campaign titled Restore to Gather which builds on our previous theme of *Restored to Life* and leads into our current theme of Gather to Witness. We want to restore our campus so we can continue to gather for generations to come.
- You will receive more information about the campaign in the very near future, including a frequently asked questions document (FAQ) on this important effort.

Once again, thank you for participating in this exciting campaign preparation process. Your input has provided critical guidance that will help to ensure the success of our upcoming campaign.


Ignite Music at Morning Mass in August

Generous Spirit

St. John's Food Shelf

Did you know that we have our own food shelf right here at St. John's? If you are not aware, our food shelf is in the storage room next to the kitchen and comprised of two sets of shelves and two cabinets for storage. We distribute nonperishable food products, personal care items, and detergents.

The food shelf was started in about 2000 in response to many requests for food by people in need and was a set of shelves in a hallway of the rectory. When St. Joseph Hall was added, the food shelf was moved to the storage area and began to have regular hours of operation. It has grown over the years and has gone from recording clients' information and visits on note cards to using software to record the information on a computer. We are now able to generate reports showing statistics such as the number of people served and the number of pounds of groceries given out in a certain period.

The food shelf was temporarily closed in March of 2019 due to the covid pandemic. Bags of food were given out by the staff to people requesting food. In April of 2021 the food shelf began accepting online food orders which were filled by volunteers and picked up at church. The food shelf was reopened for in-person shopping in March of 2022.



The only requirements for using the food shelf are that you struggle to buy food and that you live within the Mounds View school district or are a member of St. John's parish.

The food shelf is open Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 10am – Noon for walk-ins. Online orders are accepted through the St. John's website at stjohnnb.com/community-outreach/food-shelf. Paper orders are available in the kiosk near the welcome desk and can be turned in at the office. Orders may be picked up on Monday, Wednesday or Friday afternoon or evening. Emergency food bags are also available for the staff to give out in case a person has an immediate need for food outside of food shelf hours.

Thanks to your generous support, the food shelf has given out 11,422 pounds of groceries so far this year to help 107 households in need of food. Also, in June, the food shelf donated 329 cans of soup to Caring and Sharing Hands in response to a request from Mary Jo Copeland.

Donations of nonperishable food, personal care items, or detergents can be dropped off in the wooden bins near the church entrances. The box near the west entrance is in the coat room.





Medical Leftovers?

Do you have any medical leftovers after someone no longer has need of them? It is useful and you don't want to toss it, but you don't need it or want to store it? Bring it in to the Pastoral Ministry Office. We will collect and send it down to Rochester to the Rochester Medical Mission who sorts, packs and sends it on to Haiti.

If in doubt, give Mary a call at 763-242-4229. In the past, our parish has sent four carloads of goods to Rochester for Haiti. Another carload went to Haiti by way of someone traveling there as well. Another carload went to the Ukraine with a family who still had family members there in need. Know that you are helping others around the world so much, and thank you for passing on the goods they need.


