From the Parochial Vicar: Father Joseph Nguyễn



For most of July I was away on a family trip to Vietnam. It was a joy to visit the country where my parents grew up and the place of my cultural heritage. One of my favorite aspects of the trip was using the parts of Vietnamese culture that my parents taught me since I was young and seeing how it fit in it's fuller context. I was especially grateful for the gift of the Vietnamese language that my parents handed on to me, even though my skill in speaking Vi-

etnamese is not the greatest, I could communicate and connect with family and friends over there.

On the trip, I was able to visit many different places. The first week involved a lot of homecoming visits with my parents who have not been back since they fled the country in 1975. It was beautiful to catch a glimpse of what my parents' lives were like before everything was changed for them. I was also glad that I got to meet family members that I never knew I had. One of my favorite places that we visited was an orphanage in Saigon that my sister's religious community runs. It was a joy to get to know the kids, play chess with them, and to pray with them.

The other weeks were filled with fun adventures such as paddling through the rivers, lakes, mountains, and caves of Tràng An, scuba diving in Phú Quốc, and 4-wheeling over the sand dunes of Mũi Né. Of course, we made sure to get our fill of Vietnamese food while we were there.

I am grateful for the time I got to spend with my family on vacation. Being over there made me greatly appreciate being here at St. John's, especially as I was making my way back to the United States. St. John's is home and I am thankful that the Lord has placed me here at His service and the service of His people.

RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) is for children between ages 8 and 14 who have completed 2nd grade and are looking to celebrate the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, or Reconciliation. Students who have been baptized and are in need of Eucharist and First Reconciliation are also welcomed. Parents accompany the child in the process with regular meetings. 

Yes, that's right – this feature is back! There are far too many issues going on in the world – right here in the United States – to be silent, and what you do, or don't do, matters!

One of the most surprising movie hits of the Summer has taken on "Indiana Jones" and the latest version of "The Little Mermaid" and come out on top in sales! "The Sound of Freedom" is a dramatic, exciting retelling of a true story of recovering children lost to human trafficking. It follows Tim Ballard, played by Jim Caviezel (of "The Passion of the Christ" fame). Ballard worked for Homeland Security until he couldn't do that and keep searching for children lost to traffickers. So. urged by his wife, he left his job to pursue his goal to find a specific little girl stolen along with her brother. The boy was recovered and asked Ballard to find his sister, an almost impossible task. The gist of the story is to teach the audience about the prevalence and scourge of child sex trafficking. It is the fastest growing criminal enterprise in the world, out distancing drug running because "you can sell drugs once, but you can sell a child 4 or 5 times a day". The US is the largest consumer of child trafficking, our southern border offers no obstacle to the traffickers. We need to wake up. learn about the problem and what we can do to address it.

So first: get educated. Go to the movie, support people who are trying to get the word out. Angel Studios, who is involved with the TV series, "The Chosen" is distributing the movie. They are doing all they can to get people in the theatres – contact them for free tickets or to donate free tickets. The topic of the movie is gut-wrenching, but the direction is really well done. You know what it happening, but you never actually see the abuse. Even with that, I would not recommend children go. It should be only for teens and older.

Secondly: find out how you can help put a stop to the human trafficking so rampant in today's world. There are more slaves in the world today than at any other time in history – 40 million - many of them right here in the US. Learn more by going to Tim Ballard's organization, Operation Underground Railroad, ourrescue.org or to The Asservo Project at theasservoproject.org and learn more. Or go to the government website on Human Trafficking at dhs.gov/blue-campaign for more information. What you do really does matter.
