We also put together little baggies with a piece of candy and a sticker that said, "Shine God's Light-St. John the Baptist Catholic Church." It was a simple way to evangelize and share love and truth of God's love with our community. It was fun to see both children and parents admire the statues. Some of the children even recognized Jesus and were excited to see Him. I was able to share that the other statues were His parents and friends and speak a bit about Him. Fr. Joseph, Jen Livermont, and I were all dressed in our All Saints costumes as well which brought some questions and then we were able to share a bit about our saint. It was a beautiful opportunity to "Gather to Witness." We handed bulletins to those parents who we had longer conversations with. Some took the bulletins and others rejected the offer, but it was good to be able to offer them more information about our community.

We witnessed Christ's presence at our FallFest as well and it was beautiful to see the Lord show up in so many ways at the FallFest. I would like to share a story from one our parishioners Jeannie who wrote the following. I thank God for her faithfulness of being a woman of prayer. Her perseverance in gathering with the Lord in prayer gave her the opportunity to witness Christ in a profound way.

Miracle at SJB FallFest, 2023

I wish to share the miracle GOD allowed me to experience at this year's 2023 St. John the Baptist FallFest Fundraiser. Before I dropped my raffle tickets into the mesh ticket bin, I stopped, thinking of two people, **Jen** and **Leah**, who are suffering financially due to medical problems. **Jen** is a single mom whose right hand and arm was badly damaged and disabled from a bad fall two years ago, as well as permanent full body pain due to nerve damage. Multiple surgeries have been unable to fix them. She is disabled and unable to work, and Social Security will not give her disability. **Leah**, is a single mom of a high school kid who works with me at the store. He told me that his mom has a rare form of cancer, that doctors may not be able to cure. He's so scared of losing his mom.

So, I said a prayer: "God if you were to allow me to win some of these raffle money, yes I could use the money, but I know two people who could use it more. So, here, I put these tickets in not for me, but for Jen and Leah. And if it is your will that I win, then I will give all the money to them. Your will be done."

The other part of the miracle, is when I went to buy some more Booya for friends at 3:30 pm. I had been struggling most of the year with a very painful foot injury, grief issues, estate issues, and depression, which had put me in a really dark place. I had been questioning and doubting everything, spiritually, emotionally and mentally, missing church, and confession, and feeling far from God. It was at that time I was told that I had won the grand prize of \$5,000! WOW!! I thought, God does listen to prayer, and it was His will that the prize money go to Jen & Leah. Also, when I was told the winning news, I received a spiritual healing from Jesus. Suddenly, I felt pulled out of the darkness into the light, His Light. I felt Jesus was giving me a sign that even though I had pushed God away. He had not pushed me away. He knew I was struggling, that He had been beside me the whole time, and that He would stay next to me and lead me out of the darkness I had been in. I just need to trust in Him. Praise God! Glory be to Him!! What a loving Father God we have!!!







A Campaign for Saint John the Baptist Catholic Church and School Dear St. John the Baptist parishioners and friends,

As we move forward with the Restore to Gather Capital Campaign, we want to address questions posed during our recent planning study and within our faith community. Over the coming weeks, we will run a series of frequently asked questions (FAQ) in the bulletin, tackling topics ranging from our campus restoration goals to general campaign questions. The Restore to Gather Capital Campaign

Q. Why are we addressing these projects and conducting this campaign now?

A. Over the past 5 years, we have completed many smaller campus improvements, from replacing light fixtures with energy efficient LED fixtures, to upgrading campus technology, to repurposing spaces to support growth in our pre-school and grade school. It is now time to tackle some of the more major maintenance improvements which have become immediate facility needs.

Q: How will we fund these goals?

A: Our parish is in a healthy financial situation. We have been debt free for four years and have a strong parish reserve fund. We are allocating our operations surplus from our most recent fiscal year of \$197,700 to be the foundation of our fundraising effort. It is going to be a large endeavor and we will ask everyone to prayerfully consider making a sacrificial commitment to help restore our campus.

Q: Are the church projects separate from the school projects?

A: St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and School is one united parish community. The school is a vital ministry of our parish, where we help young people grow in faith and virtue. We work collaboratively on many community events like FallFest, the All Saints Party, Journey to the Inn, and Wines to Wishes. We gather in shared facilities for activities like faith formation, Sunday school, celebration of Sacraments, and more. These events and many others bring church and school together. As we work to achieve our campaign goals, we envision strengthening our entire community.







- Sunday Giving is up 12% from prior year and is 7% above budgeted. We budgeted a 3.6% increase in Sunday Giving from 2022/23 to 2023/24. We continue to ask for your ongoing financial commitment to support our important ministries and operations. Thank you!
- b. For 2023/24 we budgeted for 390 K-8 students, while enrollment is now 404. Enrollment for 2022/23 was 349.
- In 2022/23 we expensed the fees required to sell the convent (\$21,890) and realized higher utility costs. In 2023/24 we are thus far seeing utility costs that are lower than 2022/23 and below budget.
- School Operations expense is up due primarily to higher enrollment.

It is interesting to note that our Mass attendance for the month of September has gone up each year for the past two years. September's total attendance for 2023 was up 9% over 2022, and up 13% over 2021. It is delightful to see more people coming to St. John's for worship and community!

We trust in the Lord's providence in our finances as we prudently monitor our expenses. There is always reason to hope in the Lord! Thank you again for your ongoing generosity and commitment to our core values!


