Month of the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary

As we enter into October, we enter into the month of the Rosary. Our students pray a decade of the rosary before school each morning honoring our Mother and Queen. Why do we honor Mary? Well, because Jesus Christ honored her! So it is fitting that we honor her as well. I encourage you in the month of October to pray the Rosary as it is a beautiful contemplative prayer. Its repetitive nature gives way to reflecting on what Christ's life was like as you meditate on each mystery.

This month we also honor St. Therese of Lisieux as it is the 150th anniversary of her birth. We recently had a donation of two new stained glass windows of St. Therese as well as of her parents, St. Louis and St. Zelie Martin. As we see growth in the number of families at Mass, especially on Sunday mornings, and growth in our School, we entrust our SJB family to the saintly Martin family. May we all grow in holiness as we reflect the love of Christ in the home as they did.

Not only are families a place for growth in holiness, so are small groups. We began at the end of September the Small Group Leader Training formation for seventy-one parishioners and staff. It is exciting to see their willingness to learn the skills to share their faith and support others growth in holiness. Please pray for all those going through our formation, that they may be formed and equipped to share the love and goodness of Jesus Christ with their circle of influence.



St. John the Baptist Cemetery is offering a respectful and economical way to care for cremated human remains of a loved one who passed away.


