Volunteers

The volunteers who are contacting families are just that – volunteers. They have graciously agreed to donate their time and talent for the betterment of St. John the Baptist. They are serving in this role because they believe in the mission of our parish, **GO. MAKE. TEACH.**, and are passionate about its future. Thank you in advance for showing them respect and gratitude when they call.

Personal Touch

I have instructed each of our campaign volunteers to request a personal visit with members of the St. John the Baptist community. If you receive a call, I kindly ask that you:

- Take the call or return the message. Our volunteers' time is valuable, so your prompt response is greatly appreciated!
- o Meet face-to-face. If you are asked to meet, please give our volunteers 15 minutes of your time. They just want to briefly explain the campaign goals, answer your questions and receive a decision about your participation.
- Pay at your pace! This campaign seeks pledges to be fulfilled over 3 years, from 2024-2026. You can pay off your pledge at any point during these three years. Also, paying off your pledge sooner could help the parish realize cost savings. We are also accepting year-end gifts in 2023.
- Your Gift Matters! Remember, the letter you received from me includes a financial request. It is not an *expectation*. It is an *invitation*. I invite you to pray about this campaign and our parish. You may not be able to give what was asked. You may be able to give more than asked. Whatever that decision is, know that your commitment is deeply appreciated and a true blessing to our campaign.

In addition to the case statement, we have created photo boards in the plaza as well as posted videos on the campaign webpage that describe the projects we are undertaking. Thank you for your support and your dedication to our wonderful church and school!

With your help, we will make sure the healing love of Christ continues to be encountered by those who come through our doors as well as through the ministry of all those who go forth from our campus! Be assured of my prayers for you and your family.

Campaign Prayer





CHURCH IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIRS (\$3.8 MILLION)









1. RESTORE AND REFRESH CHURCH CEILING

The ceiling has significant staining and is very dirty. Solutions include repainting the ceiling, installing new acoustical treatments and cleaning the diffusers to eliminate the insulation that is falling from the ceiling.

REPLACE THE CHURCH HVAC SYSTEM

The new system will be more energy efficient and result in operational cost savings.

UPGRADE THE CHURCH SOUND SYSTEM

Our current system makes it difficult for parishioners to fully participate in the liturgy. Installing modern technology will give a new, rich sound to our worship.

2. REPAIR THE STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS ABOVE THE BAPTISTRY

These windows are cracked and leaking. We will fix the leaking issue and restore the windows to their original beauty.

3. RESURFACE THE EAST PARKING LOT

The east parking lot is showing signs of significant wear with areas of broken pavement and large cracks.

4. REFINISH THE CHURCH PEWS

Our church pews need to be refinished and restored. We received a new quote to complete this work. It is one third the original estimate and will expand the longevity of our pews for another 50 years.

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS AND REPAIRS (\$1.2 MILLION)









5. UPGRADE OUTDATED SCHOOL BATHROOMS

Our school bathrooms are inadequate and in disrepair, with some original fixtures that are over 70 years old.

6. REPLACE STAINED AND WORN SCHOOL CARPET IN THE SCHOOL

Removing the old flooring and replacing it with new will provide a freshness to our space and enhance our learning environment.

7. INSTALL RUBBER PLAYGROUND SURFACES

A rubber surface will protect our children and offer additional safety benefits. A rubber surface is also a cost-effective longer-term solution to wood chips.

8. ESTABLISH A SCHOOL OPERATIONS ENDOWMENT

The School Operations Endowment will allow us to have a continually growing fund to help subsidize teacher salaries at a higher level.




