





Next summer, July 29-August 2, St. John's is excited to be participating, once again, in Extreme Faith Camp! Students who are currently in 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade are welcome to attend as campers. Students currently in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade are invited to participate in Prayer Team or Extreme Team. Dear St. John the Baptist parishioners and friends,

ust like the Magi, who traveled far to greet baby Jesus, we too have come a long way and have made progress on completing our campaign journey. Pledges have been very generous, and we have received many encouraging comments about why parishioners and friends are supporting this campaign.

Here are a few examples:

 "We have had so many blessings in the 20 years we have been a part of this community, I want others in the future to experience the same."

 "We love St. John the Baptist and are excited to support its needs!"

- "My kids attend the school, this is our home."
- "I'm not a parishioner here, but I really appreciate your welcoming, inspirational church community."

We are blessed to have a team of dedicated parishioners and expert consultants that are providing valuable input as the scope of these vital projects develops. I wanted to provide you with some updates:

- THE CEILING After consultation with a sound engineering firm
  and discussion with two general contractors and subcontractors,
  we are moving towards applying a primer over the current
  acoustical treatment and then applying a fresh coat of acoustical
  spray. Technology has greatly improved in sound systems, and we
  are confident that we will be able to install a high-quality sound
  system that amplifies music as well as projects the spoken word
  well. By not scraping the ceiling, we will also realize cost savings. We
  would have had to apply sound treatment panels along three sides
  of the church and part of the ceiling if we scraped the ceiling and
  simply painted it.
- THE HVAC SYSTEM (HEATING, VENTILATION, AND AIR CONDITIONING) After more consultation with two general contractors and multiple subcontractors, we are moving forward with having a professional clean the diffusers and supply air ducts after we remove the black insulation that's deteriorating and falling out from inside the diffusers. We plan to install new flex piping as an upgrade and improve the current system. This will be a cost savings which will free up funds for other campaign projects as needed. We are inspecting elements from our current system that can be retained and reused and those that should be replaced. For example, the fans are in good shape, but the bearings and motors should be replaced. We are reaching out to Xcel Energy for further recommendations and to see if they offer any energy rebates for the upgrades we are doing, similar to the rebates we received when we upgraded our lights.

 THE PEWS - We are looking at removing the pews and having them refinished offsite rather than in place. By taking them offsite, we avoid having strong odors which could affect our ability to worship in the church while the refinishing takes place. While the cost is higher to have them refinished offsite, the finish will be more durable and the overall quality of the finished product will also be better.

 THE SCHOOL BATHROOMS - we are making great progress in the design phase of the bathrooms. We are moving forward with designs to have sinks in the hallways, which will reduce time in the bathrooms and allow for greater supervision. We are planning to complete as much of the work during this coming summer as possible.

 THE SCHOOL CARPET - With the remaining funds from Fund-a-Need at Wines to Wishes, we are replacing the carpet in four classrooms over Christmas break. We plan to replace the rest of the carpet in the summer with funds from this campaign.

 STAINED GLASS WINDOWS - We completed tuck pointing, sealed brick, and applied wet glazing on the stained-glass window above the baptistry. We believe that this will stop the water leak. We will know more in spring after analyzing how the upgrades handle the variables of a MN winter.

The other projects are still in process, and we plan to complete them with your help. I am grateful to our team of experts and consultants who continue to guide these decisions. We continue to strive for the \$5 million goal and we are well on our way. Any of the money not spent on the projects will go to strengthen our pastoral care ministry, which supports those in need in our community as well as cares for our homebound. We will also use excess funds to strengthen our Catholic School, so that we can help form more future saints.




