

## **Following Jesus Christ**

In our Gospel this weekend as well as last weekend, we see the Apostles respond to the Lord's invitation to follow Him. They are invited to make a commitment to live in the kingdom of Christ, that is to follow the Lord and trust in His plan. We celebrated a few weeks ago the birth of our Lord. We then celebrated the Feast of the Holy Family and witnessed that Jesus desires to live and work here in our parish family. Two weeks ago, we reflected on the Divinity of Christ as revealed on the Feast of the Epiphany. God is truly in our midst! For the second week in a row, the Lord is calling His apostles to follow Him. Do you think the Lord is trying to tell us something? We are being drawn in to commit to Christ! We desire to live in His kingdom and further His kingdom. We have celebrated the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick with twelve individuals in need of healing. Christ is meeting, loving, healing, guiding, and strengthening those who come through our doors here at St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and School. It is a joy and honor to be part of His work at this time. I invite you to join me in committing to following the Lord through our Restore to Gather Capital Campaign for St. John the Baptist Catholic Church and School. With your support, we can restore our campus and further Christ's kingdom.

Jesus not only called Peter, Andrew, James and John to follow Him, but He also calls you and me. May we respond with a resounding, "Yes!" knowing that the Lord is working through each one of us here. Wednesday Night Bible Study/Middle School Formation Wednesdays from 6:00 pm-7:30 pm in the Youth Room Over three years, students will develop a firm foundation of faith to carry with them into high school and beyond. 6th graders are studying the Old Testament. 7th and 8th graders are studying the life of Jesus through the gospels. The program features a weekly scripture study, prayer, and a competition for the kingdom cup.

Open Youth Room/Discipleship Groups

Tuesdays from 2:30 pm-4:00 pm in the Youth Room All students in 6th-8th grade are invited to gather for time as a community, prayer lessons, faith discussions, snacks, and games. Every other week we will have discipleship groups which focus on growing together as disciples of Christ.

#### Questions of the Week

**First Reading:** The people of Nineveh (the capital city of the Assyrian Empire and historic enemy of Israel) repented of their sins when they heard Jonah's warning of God's impending destruction of their city. What motivates you to repent?

**Second Reading:** Paul encouraged the believers in Corinth to live with a sense of urgency and in a radically different way than before coming to faith in Jesus. In what way are you living counterculturally as a person of faith?

Gospel Reading: This Sunday we hear the first words of Jesus in Mark's account of the call of the first disciples: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." Jesus taught that the time had come for God to come and reclaim His world. What excites you about this message?

# "A great Christmas blessing and gift" -- A Baby Saved!

December 21 - Volunteer sidewalk counselor Kay K. gave literature to a middle-aged woman as she was driving into the Whole Woman's abortion mill in Bloomington, Minn. and told her to give it to the young woman huddled up in the passenger seat. They may have seen the pro-life sign Kay had placed along the street as they approached Whole Woman's. The driver (maybe the young woman's mother?) said she was happy Kay was there and that she was doing a good thing, which left Kay confused as to what was going on, although it appeared they were there for an abortion.

Because the roof of the building that houses Whole Woman's is being replaced, the area of the parking lot closest to the door was filled with construction materials and construction workers' vehicles, so the abortion clients had to park further away from the door which gave me more time to call out to them as they walked across the parking lot. I told them we had free help for pregnant women and encouraged them to look at the ultrasound and listen to the baby's heartbeat. I might also have told them that every Christmas they will think about this missing child (as I often call out at this time of year). About an hour later, they came out and stopped to talk to Kay as they left. Now the young woman was sitting straight up and smiling. Kay asked if they had been there for an abortion and the driver said, "Yes, but she canceled the appointment!" She again said she was happy Kay was there. Kay gave them a handmade baby sweater and cap, confirmed that they still had the literature, and encouraged them to call one of the pregnancy resource centers listed if they needed any help. Soon after they drove away, the second shift of sidewalk counselors came and they were very encouraged by this story. "It was a great Christmas blessing and gift to all of us!" said Kay.
