



Generous Spirit

Meals on Wheels

One of the long-time ministries at St. John's is the Meals on Wheels (MOW) program. A cadre of volunteers are responsible for delivering nutritious food on a prearranged schedule to homebound individuals. According to our drivers, the work is rewarding. Tom Milner started as a MOW volunteer about a year ago. Tom said, "Many of the individuals find it difficult to get out, and they are appreciative of having someone bring them a hot meal or a bag of groceries. Some look forward to having someone stop over and not only bring a meal but spend a few minutes talking with them, as their days can be very lonely."

It is not a burdensome commitment. Normally a parishioner commits to one route per month. And it takes about an hour and a half to make between six and eight deliveries. The area we serve is roughly within the Mounds View school district. We pick up the hot lunch containers at an Arden Hills location from the program's overall coordinator Jeanne Szurek, a SJB parishioner who started with MOW as a volunteer in 1992 and ultimately became the area manager in 2016.

According to another volunteer, Marie Culhane: "Bringing someone a hot meal and allowing them to age in place with dignity is a simple kindness we can all afford to give... I began driving for MOW in 2010. Mary Justin (who volunteered for MOW for approximately 25 years) recruited me during the annual Ministry Fair at St. John's. This was exactly what I needed, having just been widowed and looking for a way to serve others as I traveled through my grief journey. I was assigned MOW delivery every third Friday; however, I was reluctant to "go solo," so I recruited a then-new acquaintance to join me in my mission. That acquaintance, who was on his own grief journey, and I delivered many MOWs together. The 'dates' to deliver meals as acts of service and healing led us into friendship, then courtship and eventually marriage. In lieu of wedding gifts, we asked our guests to make a donation to MOW.... '

We have drivers of all ages. While some complete the route alone, volunteers often have friends, children, grandchildren or spouses accompany them.



Gather to Witness in our Finances!

The financial report above summarizes St. John's operating revenues and expenses for the first 6 months of the fiscal year with a comparison to the same period last year and to the year-to-date budget for the current fiscal year. Below are notes on the numbers, arranged with letters that correspond to letters in the table. Thank you for your generosity!

- a. Sunday Giving is up 4% from prior year but is 2.2% below budget. We budgeted a 3.6% increase in Sunday Giving from 2022/23 to 2023/24. The differences you see here are due to timing of gifts and budget allocation. We continue to ask for your ongoing financial commitment to support our important ministries and operations. Thank you!
- For 2023/24 we budgeted for 390 K-8 students, while enrollment is now 401. Enrollment for 2022/23 was 349.
- c. In 2022/23 we realized income from the sale of the convent, \$35,700.
- d. In 2022/23 we expensed the fees required to sell the convent (\$21,890) and realized higher utility costs. In 2023/24 we are thus far seeing utility costs that are lower than 2022/23 and below budget.
- School Operations expense is up due primarily to higher enrollment.

It is interesting to note that our Mass attendance, as measured in October each year, has been growing steadily since 2020, and we are approaching the 2019 pre-pandemic attendance level. It is delightful to see more people coming to St. John's for worship and community!
