

Don't Do Lent Alone

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him." Mark 1:12-13

Lent already? If you are asking this question, it is indeed with merit. We were just getting our valentines sent and now we are donning the purple and entering this season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. In our Becoming Catholic OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults), the earlier Lent has meant condensing of lessons with our candidates to get them to this third leg of the OCIA process. We are currently entering Lent or the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. After careful instruction, discernment, and sponsor involvement, our candidates are now ready to spend these forty days diving into deeper reflection and meditation, drawing closer to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Church opens Her storehouse of many graces and blessings as we present to them the different Rites and Presentations that will unfold in the next several weeks rotating at our different Sunday Mass times. The Penitential Rite for the baptized preparing them for their first confession and the series of Scrutiny's for the unbaptized Elect preparing for baptism, have the purpose of a beautiful dance of letting the Holy Spirit come into their souls "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful... and to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good". 141 RITE for OCIA. The humility involved in this work is something that all of us can enter into. Each year it strikes me that this is no light invitation for the weak of heart, but a courageous intentional work to embark on. An adventure with the Holy Spirit that is best done with the accompaniment of other faithful. For our candidates, they have had the ongoing personal support of their sponsor at every weekly class time as well as a friendship outside of class to be mentored and accompanied in the faith. In today's Rite of Sending, we ask our St. John's church community to join your prayers for our candidates. Later this afternoon, we'll gather at the Cathedral for the **Rite of Election** where we'll ask the entire Archdiocese to pray for all our Elect and candidates who will be celebrating the Sacraments during the Easter Vigil. It takes a community of prayer, accompaniment, and witness to bring about this work of spiritual purification and enlightenment.

As you enter this Lenten time of spiritual wrestling, don't do Lent alone. Amidst the temptations in the desert, Jesus was ministered to by angels. Our OCIA candidates have had sponsors. Find someone or a small group to accompany you as you enter into the dance of letting the Holy Spirit uncover then heal, bring out then strengthen. Let us pray for one another and anticipate a rejoicing at the end of these forty days with how the Holy Spirit will work in the dance of conversion in our lives.



Catholic Fasting / Abstinence Rules

Catholics age 14 and older do not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays during Lent, including Good Friday. Instead of meat many Catholics choose to eat fish - which is why many parishes around the country have fish fries on Fridays during Lent. These are a great opportunity for a parish community to come together to pray and fast.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics age 18 to 59 also limit the amount of food they eat. Only one full meal, and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal, are eaten. The best rule of thumb is to make sure your meals are smaller than what you would eat on a normal day - and to avoid snacks. Exemption is allowed for pregnant women and those who need regular meals for medical reasons.

You may have heard the words "fasting" and "abstinence" used when talking about Lent. "Fasting" is the word used when the amount of food eaten is limited. "Abstinence" is when you completely give something up, like meat, for a set period of time. Both "fasting" and "abstinence" play an important role during Lent.

Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

Question: What do the colors of the priest's and deacon's vestments mean?

Answer: In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, the colors of the vestments evolved over the course of several centuries and there was wide variation both in the colors used, and in the feasts and seasons associated with particular colors. It was Pope Innocent III (d. 1216) who gave us the basic outline that was later prescribed by Pope Saint Pius V in 1570. The various colors remind us of the dominant themes of a particular season or celebration.

- White: Used for the seasons of Christmas and Easter and in celebrations of the Lord, of Mary, the angels, and saints who were not martyrs. This color is also used in Masses for the dead, at baptisms, weddings and other festive celebrations.
- Red: As the color of both blood and fire, red is used on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, as well as Pentecost and special celebrations of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, red is used on the feasts and memorials of the Apostles and those saints who died as martyrs.
- Violet: The color for Advent and Lent. Violet may also be used in Masses for the dead and on All Souls Day (November 2).
- Green: A color of life and hope, green is used throughout Ordinary Time.
- Other colors: Rose may be used on the Third Sunday
 of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent, black may
 be used in Masses of the dead and on All Souls Day,
 gold or silver may be used on solemn occasions in
 place of white, red, or green.
